MINUTES OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

The special meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration was called to order by Mr. M. L. Vanlandingham, Chairman, in the Auditorium, Room 315, United Bank Building, 3500 North Central Avenue; Phoenix, Arizona, at 9:20 A.M., February 18, 1971.

It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that minutes of the meetings of the Board on December 11, 1970, and January 7, 1971, be approved as presented. Motion carried.

FORMAL HEARINGS

Chairman Vanlandingham announced that it was the time and place for the formal hearing in the matter of Complaint No. 71001, Gordon Finley Powers, a registered Architect, No. 4038.

Respondent Gordon Finley Powers indicated he was present, representing himself and was ready to proceed.

The Board was represented by Stirley N. Cantor, Assistant Attorney General. The hearing was held and at the conclusion the Board found the following:

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that in regard to Complaint No. 71001 in the matter of Gordon Finley Powers this Board finds him guilty of the charges contained therein. Motion carried with seven ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the certificate of registration of Gordon Finley Powers be suspended for a period of six months. Motion carried with seven ayes.

The Board's Finding of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order of Suspension, signed by the Secretary of the Board, Charles W. Newlin, are a part of Gordon Finley Powers' registration file No. 4038.

At 1:00 P.M., February 18, 1971, the Chairman announced that it was the time and place for the formal hearing, the matter of Complaint No. 71002, John K. Parsons, a registered Civil Engineer, No. 4426, and Structural Engineer, No. 4427.

Respondent John K. Parsons indicated he was present, represented by counsel Peter T. D'Angelo, and was ready to proceed.

The Board was represented by Stirley N. Cantor, Assistant Attorney General. The hearing was held and at the conclusion the Board found the following:

It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Girand that he be found not guilty of the charges in Complaint No. 71002. Motion carried with seven ayes.

The Board's Finding of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order, signed by the Secretary of the Board, Charles W. Newlin, are a part of John K. Parsons' registration file No. 4426 and No. 4427.

At 3:30 P.M., February 18, 1971, the Chairman announced that it was the time and place for the formal hearing in the matter of Complaint No. 71003, Robert Roland Johnson, a registered Civil Engineer, No. 6391.

Respondent Robert Roland Johnson indicated he was present, represented by counsel Phillip Weeks, and was ready to proceed.

The Board was represented by Stirley N. Cantor, Assistant Attorney General. The hearing was held and at the conclusion the Board found the following:

It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that Mr. Johnson be found guilty of the charges contained in the Complaint No. 71003 and that Mr. Johnson's certificate of registration to practice as a Civil Engineer be suspended for the a period of three months. Motion carried with seven ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Cassidy and seconded by Mr. Girand that because of the mitigating circumstances in this case, the registrant's certificate of registration be reinstated. Motion carried with six ayes and one abstention.

The Board's Finding of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order, signed by the Secretary of the Board, Charles W. Newlin, are a part of Robert Roland Johnson's registration file No. 6391.

At 10:00 A.M., February 19, 1971, the Chairman announced that it was the time and place for the formal hearing in the matter of Complaint No. 71004, Joseph Samuel Folkner, a registered Landscape Architect, No. 7015.

Respondent Joseph Samuel Folkner indicated he was present, representing himself, and was ready to proceed.

The Board was represented by Stirley N. Cantor, Assistant Attorney General. The hearing was held and at the conclusion the Board found the following:

It was moved by Mr. Cassidy and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that in the case of Mr. Joseph Samuel Folkner he be found guilty of the charges in Complaint No. 71004. Motion carried with seven ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the certificate of registration of Mr. Folkner be suspended for a period of ninety days after date of notification. Motion carried with seven ayes.

The Board's Finding of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order of Suspension, signed by the Secretary of the Board, Charles W. Newlin, are a part of Joseph Samuel Folkner's registration file No. 7015.

The foregoing formal hearings, in each instance, were transcribed by John A. Brabec, Court Reporter.

REPORT OF THE RULES & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

A letter from Max Wold, regarding renewal fees, Minute Page 2836, was presented for the Board's consideration. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that we advise Mr. Wold by referring to the established fees which were set at the last September meeting. Motion carried.

A letter from Thane H. Baldwin, Jr., regarding the rules as it pertains to land surveyors, Minute Pages 2837 and 2838, was presented for the Board's consideration. It was suggested by Mr. Girand that it be referred to the Rules and By-Laws Committee for their report at the next meeting of the Board.

REPORT OF THE EVALUATION AND EXAMINATION COMMITTEES

The Architectural Examination Committee presented the results of the architectural examinations given in December, 1970, as shown on Minute Pages 2839 and 2840.

It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the architectural grades as presented be so certified. Motion carried.

The Landscape Architectural Committee presented the results of the landscape architectural examinations given in December, 1970, as shown on Minute Page 2841.

It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the landscape architectural grades as presented be so certified. Motion carried.

The Engineering Evaluation Committee presented the results of the engineering and other examinations given in December, 1970, as shown on Minute Pages 2842 through 2849.

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the engineering and other examinations' grades as presented be so certified. Motion carried.

The Executive Director presented the application of Dean Walter J. Fahey for the Board's consideration. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that this application be referred to the evaluation committee for study and recommendation to the Board. Motion carried.

Dear Mr. Girand:

I would like to bring to your attention an injustice relative to the renewal of Certificates of Registration. For several years I have been registered in two branches of engineering and each year I have paid the \$10 fee for each category even though it seemed to be an injustice to pay the double fee. As you know, my being registered in two categories does not cost the Technical Registration Board one cent more than if I were registered in only one category. By the same token, if I drop one category to save myself \$20, it wouldn't save the Board one cent.

A.R.S. 32-127 C gives the Board the responsibility to establish renewal fees. All costs are going up and a fee increase to \$20 is certainly justified. I only feel that a more conscientious interpretation could be made where a person is registered in more than one branch. May I suggest that the statutes be interpreted to allow "A registrant holding a Certificate of Registration in more than one class shall not be required to pay an annual renewal fee greater than for one Certificate."

Please let me know how your committee and the Board feels about this suggestion. If possible, I would like to know prior to December 31.

Gentlemen:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of November 27, 1970, relative to licensing and the practice of land surveying in Arizona.

The writer has made a careful study of the Code and the Rules and By-Laws of the State Board of Technical Registration. It is believed that there is a serious conflict between requirements of the Code and the permissive policy stated by your letter and of Rule IV (A), Rules and By-Laws.

A.R.S. 32-121 states plainly and clearly that any person desiring to practice land surveying shall first secure a certificate of registration. A.R.S. 32-143 states ".....Registrants under this chapter may engage in practice in another category regulated pursuant to this chapter only to the extent that such person is qualified and as such work may be necessary and incidental to the work of his profession on a specific project. ... " It is clearly the intent of this provision of the Code to limit the practice of a registrant in another regulated category. It is easily seen that Rule IV (A), Rules and By-Laws is in direct conflict with the Code when it states ".....shall be in accordance with the custom and tradition of the registrant's certificate of registration....". Thus, the Board has opened the door for the civil engineer to engage in the practice of land surveying with the registrant being the sole judge as to his own competence in the field and to the relationship of such work to the work of his profession. There can be aberrant improbity involved. Actually, there is very little land survey work required of a civil engineer that is necessary and incidental to the work of his profession. It follows that a civil engineer should be doing very little classical land surveying. It is a fact, however, that a very considerable amount of such work is being done by civil engineers.

There can be no question that many of these civil engineers are eminently well qualified to do land survey work and should have a certificate of registration for this practice. Many others are unqualified to do classical land surveying simply because they have taken neither the time nor made the opportunity to exhaustively study the principles involved. There is a very vast difference between measuring distances and turning angles, as usually done by civil engineers, and the art of re-establishing boundaries of properties, which is the classical form of the practice of land surveying.

During the past five years, the undersigned has become professionally acquainted with the work of several civil engineers who were doing classical land surveying. This work involved either straight retracement surveys of previously subdivided land, or retracement surveys of established boundaries for the subdivision of adjacent unsubdivided property. In each case, the civil engineer did a mathematically precise subdivision of the subject section, or part thereof, while totally ignoring as immaterial the evidence of previous surveys and the position of monuments so located. The conclusion can thus be drawn, that while the work of the civil engineer is mathematically correct, the resulting product is totally unacceptable.

There can be no doubt that many civil engineers are well qualified by education, training and experience to be eligible for a land surveyors license. This qualification must be determined by proceedures other than "custom and tradition". It must be done by a demonstration of competency. It is neither right nor proper, nor in the best interest of either of the professions nor of the Public, to rely on "custom and tradition" as the determination of competency of the civil engineer to perform classical land surveys. No civil engineer who is properly qualified as a land surveyor should have the slightest objection to this proceedure as it not only affords the Public with the protection the law intended to give it, it also protects the professional by his knowing that land surveying is being performed only by those who have demonstrated proper competency.

The undersigned formally requests that your Honorable Board commence immediately to enforce the provisions of Statute Law and your Code, and to amend your By-Laws so that the practice of land surveying, as defined, be performed only by registered land surveyors.

The 'planners' in this area are allegedly 'assuming' roles which appear to be normal to the Architectural, Landscape Architecture and Engineering functions as prescribed by the Code of the State Board of Tech. Registration, amended April 1970.

The word 'planning' does appear in each of the above categories. However, the AIP is recommending the following which could nullify all of the 'planning' work of those three professional categories...by that Society's broad interpretation of the word, 'planning'.

In municipal government work it is particularly a sensitive topic since traditionally a Planner had assumed a function without knowledge of the governing Statutes or the definition between his role and that of newly formed Specialists Offices.

for the purpose of discussing means of reviewing construction drawings for buildings submitted for building permit which do not have sufficient information to assure construction of a building conforming to Safety Code requirements.

Mr. Seinerth stated that the submission of incomplete plans has become a chronic problem with some registrants - that additional plan checking fees and resubmittal time have not been effective in correcting the problem. The City of Phoenix staff in cooperation with American Institute of Architects have suggested the appointment of a Committee for reviewing plans and filing complaints against registrants who continually submit incomplete plans; however, City Attorney has expressed the opinion that until Building Permit has been issued, plans are not available for public review. The City will not allow review of such plans due to liability involved.

City Attorney suggested State Board of Technical Registration provide for plan review committee under its Rules and By-Laws with authority to review plans prior to issue of Building Permit. This would operate at a State level and would reduce liability of parties concerned provided review requirements conform to reasonable consistent professional practice.

The Committee recommends this be placed on Agenda for Board discussion at next special meeting.

Dear Mr. Edelblut:

A recent legal opinion has provided a new opportunity for the California Board to extend to professional engineers registered by your Board the maximum degree of comity recognition permitted by California law. This recognition will extend to professional engineer registrants who were registered initially after passing the regular written EIT and professional examination series.

In the future, eligible applicants will be required to return a mail questionnaire to indicate knowledge of California law. Applicants for civil engineer registration will be expected to indicate general knowledge of the seismic problems as they affect states on the Pacific seaboard. Most applicants will not be required to appear in person.

The Board is encouraging the use of the NECC certification, and is revising policies to simplify the intrastate registration of qualified professional engineers.

It is likely that the applicant will find this new procedure a reasonable approach, and that your Board will find these revised procedures much more acceptable than some that were previously in force.

Dear Mr. Edelblut,

We appreciate your prompt response to our previous letters.

We interpret the first paragraph of your letter of March 1, 1971 to imply that 'public service corporations' such as a City or Municipal governmental body are not exempt from providing an Arizona Technical Registrant when functioning in those services normally assigned to a Technical Registrant by the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration.

Further, we interpret that A.R.S. 32-142 does govern in-house functions by City or Municipalities and their consultants for 'public-works' projects.

However, these governmental bodies are not involved solely with 'public-works' projects. The Department of Community Development of this City has been installed for a more viable urban environment for its citizenry, controlling proposed development, redevelopment, rehabilitation and conservation of buildings, landscapes and marinescapes...most of which are by private developers.

The Planners are assuming those functions normally assigned to Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Engineering which affect 'public' and 'non-public works' projects under disguise of sophisticated titles, recommended by the AIP parameters and identified in my letter of January 12, 1971.

We interpret that the Code identifies 'planning' within the normal services of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Engineering and that 'planning' is not a seperated entity recognized by the Board as a professional service in performance of those functions.

Dear Mr. Craft:

As per our telephone conversation on January 8, 1971 regarding the need for more action and cooperation by the State Board of Technical Registration. And the necessity of more positive support for the Board from the Attorney General's Office, I report these facts, with documented proof.

- Six years ago the architects requested that the consulting engineers prepare guide lines for the minimum electrical requirements to be included on electrical drawings in complete sets of design plans issued for all types of projects under the Registered Architect Seal. This was done by a committee and survey of all electrical engineers in private practice. The State Board reviewed this effort and with the approval of the architects, it was accepted as a minimum standard.
- (2) To date, in spite of an excess number of flagrant violations by unethical architects (see exhibits 1 and 2), nothing has been done. The City of Phoenix Building Department has repeatedly requested that the Board require complete project plans from the architects to minimize the paperwork in their overloaded inspection Department, also with no results. (A conservative estimate indicates at least 20-25% of projects in Phoenix alone fit into this category). Example No. 3 refers to Contractor Design. Most cities permit contractors to prepare and . submit plans for new and remodeled construction in complete violation of state laws. Phoenix sets a 500KVA service limit which allows contractors to build complexes with electrical systems of sufficient size to power over 75% of all buildings now under construction. This must be stopped.

if the State Board has been relegated to an agency that only registers and collects fees from architects and engineers, instead of its main purpose of protecting the health and safety of the public, see the law, then lets state this fact publicly and dispense with their entire operation. This will not only save the taxpayers a considerable sum each year, but all registrants will be spared the annual fee payment, which under the present method of operation, can only be considered a subsidy or political kickback.

03 MATERIALS

a. Topsoil shall be a natural, fertile, friable soil, possessing characteristics of the representative productive soils in the vicinity. It shall be obtained from naturally well drained areas. It shall not be excessively acid or alkaline nor contain toxic substances which may be harmful to plant growth. The topsoil shall be without admisture of subsoil and be clean and reasonable free of clay lumps, stones, stumps, roots, substances 2" or more in diameter, debris or other objects which might be a hindrance to planting operations. The topsoil shall not be delivered or used in a muddy conditions

b. Manure shall be well rotted, unleached stable or cattle manure, reasonable free of shavings, sawdust or refuse. It shall not contain any harmful materials or over 10% straw.

c. Fertilizer shall conform to the applicable state fertilizer laws, be uniform in composition, be dry and free-flowing and be delivered to the site in the original, labeled, unopened containers, each bearing the manufacturer's guaranteed. analysis. Any fertilizer which becomes caked or otherwise damaged, making it unsuitable for use, will not be accepted. It shall be a complete fertilizer, part of the elements of which are derived from organic sources, and shall contain the following percentages by weight:

Nitrogen 10% Phosphoric acid 5% Potash 5%

d. Lawn seed shall be Cynodon dactylon (Bermuda grasa). It shall be fancy hulled seed having a purity of at least 91%, a germination of at least 88% and a weed seed content of not over 0.35%. Winter lawn seed shall be annual rye grass seed with a purity of at least 95% and a germination of at least 88%. The seed shall be fresh and clean and be "new-drop" seed. All seed shall be delivened in the original, unopened, labeled packages which shall bear a guaranteed analysis by a recongnized authority.

e. Stakes for supporting the trees shall be and at least 8' long.

- f. Wire for fastening the trees to the stakes shall not be lighter than 14 gage, pliable, galvanized, steel wire.
- g. Hose for encasing the wires used for fastening the trees to the stakes shall be either new or used, 2-ply, reinforced rubber, garden hose.
- h. All planting areas shall have a finished ground covering of Black Glacier peat moss.

O4 PLANTS

The plants shall have a habit growth that is normal for the species, be sound, healthy and vigorous and be free of insects, pests, plant diseases and injuries. All plants shall equal or exceed the measurements specified in the Planting List, which are the minimum acceptable sixes. They shall be measured before pruning, with the branches in a normal position. Any necessary pruning shall be done at the time of planting. Requirements for the measurement, branching, grading and quality of plants in the Planting for the measurement, branching, grading and quality of plants in the Planting List generally follow the code of standards currently recommended by the American Association of Nurserymen, Inc., in the publication, American Standard for Nursery Stock.

- 1. Backfill in planting holes shall be in the proportion of one part well rotted cattle manure to four parts top soil and 20 lbs. of sulphur. The manure to be placed in the bottom half of the soil pocket and thoroughly mixed with top soil and sulphur.
- 2. Holes for planting trees shall be at least 5' deep and of a volume equal to a hole 5 feet in diameter and 5 feet deep. Plants designated 5 gallon or 1 gallon in the planting List shall be in 5 gallon or 1 gallon containers respectively and shall not have been in the containers for such length of time as to cause a 'hardening-off' of the root system. The plants shall not be handled in such manner that they are pulled out of the container or that injury is caused to twigs and branches. Instead, they shall be removed from the container in such a way as to retain a firm, natural ball of earth of sufficient diameter and depth to encompass the root system necessary for full recovery of the plant. Any breaking or cracking of the ball shall be prevented during the planting process.

SAMPLES, TESTS, INSPECTIONS

The landscaping contractor shll be responsible for all certificates of inspection of plant materials that may be required by Federal, state or other authorities to accompany the shipment of the plants. The plants shall be subject to inspectiong and approval before they are planted. Inspection of the plants at the place of growth or upon delivery shall ge for the quality, size and variety only and shall not in any way impair the right of rejection for failure to meet other requirements during the progress of the work.

SETTING PLANTS

The plants shall be planted in pits, be centered and be set on at least 3" of prepared soil so that the finished gradw level at the plant after settlement will be the same as that at which the plant was grown. The plants shall be planted upright and be faced to give the best appearance or relationship to adjacent structures. Roots shall be spread in their normal position. All broken or frayed roots shall be dut off tleanly. The prepared soil shall be placed and compacted carefully to avoid injury to roots and to fill all voids. When the hole is nearly filled, water shall be added as necessary and be allowed to soak away. The hole shall be filled to the finished grade and be fertilized as hereinafter specified and a shallow saucer shall be formed around each plant by placing a ridge of topsoil around the outside edge of each pit. After the ground settles, additional prepared soil shall be filled in to the level of the finished grade. At mass planting, the entire area shall be treated as one saucer.

09 FERTILIZING

On completion of the backfilling of the planting pit, each plant shall be fertilized with the fertilizer specified. The fertilizer shall be applied by being evenly spread over the surface of the planting pit and be being lightly worked into the soil. It shall then be thoroughly watered.

The trees shall be supported immediately after being planted and be single staked. The wires shall be encased in hose to prevent direct contact with the bark of the trees and be placed around the trunk in a single loop. The wires shall be tightened and be kept taut by twisting the strands together. A single stake shall be placed in a few inches from the trunk of each tree and be driven vertically into the ground to a depth of 22 to 3 feet in such manner as not to injure the roots. The trees shall be fastened at the top of the stake and midway between the top of the stake and the ground to insure proper support.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Report by Arizona delegate, Joyce Smith, of attendance to the Western Zone of the National Council of Engineering Examiners annual meeting in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, on May 17-18, 1971, as shown on Minute Pages 2910, 2911 and 2912, was presented for the Board's information.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Cassidy reported that his committee had held no meeting in order to review the 1972-73 preliminary budget studies, and requested Mr. Drewry to amplify on the preliminary budget studies he had prepared.

At this time, Mr. Drewry presented the Cash Flow Report #4, as shown on Minute Page 2913, and pointed out the fact that since our predicted expenses for June would exceed the appropriated monies allowed, he had requested an opinion from the Attorney General's office in order that the deficit amount shown could be drawn from the reserve fund. He stated that at the time of the meeting, the opinion had not yet been received from the Attorney General. Mrs. Stirley Cantor, Assistant Attorney General, stated she would suggest to Mr. Fred Stork, the Assistant Attorney General who was to answer our request for the opinion, that a favorable opinion could be written be referring to A.R.S. 32-106 (D and E).

In referring to Cash Flow Report #4, Mr. Cassidy explained to the Board how the deficit had occurred, such as the amount paid to Data Processing Service of the State Department of Finance which had not been budgeted, the two Executive Director's salaries and the increase in examination preparation and grading services. Therefore, he felt no blame could be laid to the administration duties of the office because of these unexpected expenses.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the preliminary budget studies for 1972-73 be referred to the Budget Committee for their review with the Chairman calling a special meeting for an appropriate time in order to permit the office to file same with the Commissioner of Finance as required by September first. Motion carried.

The Board then went into Executive Session to discuss the salary for the Executive Director for Fiscal Year 1971-1972. At the conclusion of this executive session, it was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the Executive Director to be in the same salary given to us June 10, 1971, as grade 10, step 4, in the amount of \$16,538.00, for fiscal year 1971-72. Motion carried.

WESTERN ZONE, NATIONAL COUNCIL OF ENGINEERING EXAMINERS ANNUAL MEETING, COEUR d'ALENE, IDAHO

May 17 - 18, 1971

After the preliminaries of opening the meeting, President Chester A. Arents advised the Western Zone members that one of the recommendations for the Annual Meeting in San Juan, Puerto Rico, would be to shorten the annual meeting from Monday through Wednesday instead of Sunday through Friday for subsequent annual meetings.

Another suggestion for the annual meeting was not to have off-shore meetings but to centralize the location for same. Also, the members of the Western Zone would appreciate knowing the dates and location at least five to ten years in advance for budgetary reasons.

The Executive Secretary reported on the increase of the national examinations as follows:

April, 1970, EIT exams - 7,000 April, 1970, PE exams - 3,400 April, 1971, EIT exams - 12,000 April, 1971, PE exams - 5,800

He also reported there were approximately 4,100 national engineering certificates sissued to date.

He reported that the council was financially in good shape from the above fees which were collected for these services.

Regarding the relocation of the National Office, careful study will have to be made before a move would be considered.

Past President Allen discussed the various committees as outlined in the National Proceedings. He suggested that the members of each Zone should let the Director of that Zone know what members would like to serve on the National Committees.

Past President Allen as Chairman of the Nominating Committee advised that the President-Elect for the 1971 annual meeting would come from the Southern Zone and the recommendation by the committee to be made at this meeting for President-Elect was Roy T. Sessums from Louisiana. He advised that the President-Elect for the 1972 meeting will come from the Western Zone.

Mr. Ochs of the Colorado Board reported for O. O. Phillips, Chairman of the Uniform Laws and Procedures Committee. He advised that the synopsis had been brought up to date for the first time in six years. Mr. Phillips plans to up date the synopsis every year and requests each Board to please advise him of any changes in their respective laws.

Mr. S. M. Barton, Chairman of the Joint International Committee with CCPE, reported this committee was to maintain a liaison between the Canadian Council of Professional Engineers and other foreign engineering councils. This committee meets with the Canadian Council, even years in United States and odd years in Canada. The next meeting will be June 4-5 in Novia Scotia. Mr. Barton introduced Mr. Bill Hall, Registrar of the British Columbia Council.

Mr. Hall advised that the requirements for registration in Canada was the applicant who was a graduate of an accredited university would take a 30-hour examination at that time and after two years of practical experience would then be granted professional registration without further examination. Minimum age for professional registration is 23 years. If an applicant was not a graduate of an accredited school he would be required to take the examination per the syllabus.

Mr. R. W. Millard, Chairman of the Land Surveying Committee, reported on the progress of the committee since the annual meeting in Chicago when the model law for land surveyors was presented and at which time the model law was Chapter One and the land surveying law was Chapter 2. The convention at that time did not approve of Chapter 2 and the land surveying committee was charged with the Joint Board Model Law. He outlined the new proposed Joint Board Model Law which would be presented at the annual meeting in San Juan. He reported on the information secured from the various Boards as to the number of hours required for the examination individually and the results on a national basis were:

27 states (56%) - 16 hour examinations
1 state - 13 hour "
2 states - 12 hour "
16 states (34%) - 8 hour "
1 state - 7 hour "
1 state - 4 hour "

77% give two or more examinations each year and 23% give one exam per year

He advised that a synopsis of land surveying laws will be available June first and any inquiries for purchase of this synopsis such as American Congress on Surveying and Mapping to advise the cost of \$10.00 per copy.

Mr. George E. Sutton, Nevada, discussed the role of the professional in Engineering Curriculum Design by referring to the annual report of ECPD dated September 30, 1970. He said of the inspectors for ECPD, 174 out of 480 or 34% are people who are not employed in education and on many visits they were educators looking at educators. He stated that the requirements for accreditation in this annual report required 18 hours for math, 18 hours for basic sciences, 36 hours for engineering sciences and 18 hours for humanities. There was no established credit hours for analysis and design.

Mr. Grant Borg, Utah, reported on recommendations for changes to the Constitution and By-Laws:

- 1. Change the title of Executive Secretary to Executive Director
- Change the title of present Zone Directors to Vice-Presidents which would mean on the Board of Directors there would be four Vice-Presidents, President, President-Elect and Past-President.
- 3. Board of Directors could amend the By-Laws by two-thirds vote in the interim between annual meetings.
- 4. Increase the bode of the Executive Secretary from \$10,000 to \$100,000
- 5. Shorten the annual meeting.

Mr. Borg requested reports by the various states on any changes to their State Registration Laws. Arizona reported on their one minor change and the other states reporting were: California, Colorado and Oregon. Idaho reported no changes to their law but a Geology Board had been established by this year's legislature.

Dr. H. Sid Smith of Idaho discussed the National Examinations. He reported on the development of the multiple choice (morning) examination for Fundamentals. The national committee was required to review 664 questions first submitted by the various committee members who had prepared so many in each subject. From these 664, the committee finally selected the 160 questions used for the April, 1971, examinations, which were furnished by Educational Testing Service. For evaluation purposes, the grading is divided into three groups:

He advised that the morning examination results were in the mail to the individual Boards and they would receive a raw score and converted score which would be added with the afternoon examination being graded by the NCEE Central Grading Service on a basis of 50% for the morning. He, also, reported that from the morning examination an evaluation of each problem could be made by Educational Testing Service. The results of this analysis indicated to the committee that for the December, 1971, examinations there would be 41 questions repeated from the April, 1971, examinations which they call equators, and another 40 questions could be reused with modification. It was his personal opinion that the fundamentals could be extended to the full eight-hour examination. Discussion followed as to the professional examination given by National Council of Engineering Examiners, and the State of Washington wished to have an improvement in this examination or they would be forced to prepare it themselves. Other states concurred.

Mr. Henry Ochs of Colorado advised that their new law changes affected reciprocity. It now allowed the use of the NBER certificate, and an engineer who graduated from an engineering curriculum with twenty years of engineering practice and ten years in responsible charge would not be required to take an additional examination if the Colorado Board determined he was qualified. In order for the engineer to be granted on reciprocity basis throughout the nation, Mr. Ochs recommended that there be changes to the model law, each State law and in Board policy. Also, suggested that personal interviews be eliminated.

The Site Committee for the 1972 Western Zone meeting selected Jackson Hole, Wyoming and beacuse of weather conditions, it would be the last week in May. Because of the good attendance to this meeting as it was held on Monday and Tuesday instead of Friday and Saturday, it was suggested that the next meeting be held the first part of the week.

Subject: Professional Registration

Gentlemen:

We are contacting you to discuss the procedures and requirements for professional registration for Architects, Assayers, Engineers, etc., in your state.

Mr. Regis I. Campbell, P.E., Past-President of the Cleveland Chapter of the Ohio Society of Professional Engineers, applied for registration in Arizona by reciprocity. Mr. Campbell is a graduate of an E.C.P.D. accredited school, has passed a 16 hour examination for professional registration as a structural engineer in his home state (Note: Ohio law requires a minimum of eight hours of examination in the registrant's major branch of engineering) and has been practicing as a professional here and in seven other states in which he holds registration.

> In your correspondence with Mr. Campbell you forwarded copies of Rules and By-Laws and the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration and instructions for filing of the application sent to him. Upon satisfactory completion of the application requirements, he was notified by the board to appear for a personal interview and a 20 to 30 minute examination covering the Statutes and Rules. The time for the Bregoing was set by the board and the tone of the notice was such that it was imperative that the candidate should keep the appointment or be assigned a later date set by the discretion of the board. At considerable expense and the use of the better part of two business days, Mr. Campbell traveled to Phoenix where he took the aforementioned exam (passed) and was interviewed by the Evaluation Committee.

> At the close of the interview the applicant was told that in spite of his qualifications and active practice as a structural engineer, he must undergo eight hours of examination to obtain registration as a structural engineer in the state of Arizona because the board has an unwritten policy requiring this.

To: Arizona State Board of Technical Registration June 9, 1971

Further, the applicant must make application to undergo said eight hours of examination which will be offered in December 1971.

If it pleases the board and the other interested parties to whom this letter is being sent, we would like to make remarks regarding Mr. Campbell's qualifications and the written requirements of the state of Arizona:

- 1. Page 6, Paragraph 9 of Rules and By-Laws states that a graduate of an E.C.P.D. accredited engineering curriculum will be given credit for Fundamentals of Engineering; subsequently, 16 hours of examination for structural engineering registrants would be the requirement. Mr. Campbell has taken a 16-hour exam in Ohio with 8 hours of this in structures.
- 2. Section 32-144 of the Code states that "a consulting associate of a registrant, if he is a non-resident with no established place of business in this state and is qualified to practice in the state or country where he resides" may practice and perform engineering functions on projects to be built in Arizona without compliance with the requirements of this Chapter. Mr. Campbell is permitted by this section to perform the same engineering duties you will by unwritten policy not permit him to become registered to perform.
- 3. Page 10, Section E of Rules and By-Laws Mr. Campbell apparently satisfied this section. (See letter dated April 16, 1971, from State Board to R.I. Campbell.)
- 4. There was no correspondence from the board to the applicant that would indicate that upon completion of a 20 to 30-minute examination and an interview there would be an unwritten irrevocable policy revealed and enforced, a policy which requires the applicant to again undergo the financial expenditure incurred for the 20 minute examination and interview.

The Board of Direction of Cleveland Society for Professional Engineers is of the opinion that the action of the Arizona State Board is neither acting in the interests of the engineer nor in the best interests of the people of Arizona if this is the manner in which they conduct their office. We believe the unwritten policy decisions of the Arizona Board lays emphasis to the need for uniform registration laws!



The question of the AIA being able to assist the City of Phoenix in the review of what are deemed sketchy or inadequate plans submitted for plan check has again been up for discussion. I met with Francis Bricker's sub-committee of the Building and Safety Advisory Board, Charles Raines, Bill Carey and the City Attorney, Mr. Riggs, this part Tuesday.

The City Attorney has changed his former opinion and will now get the City Council to adopt an ordinance which in part will say that the plans and specs are a "public record" at the time the initial set is submitted to the city for plan check.

With the above matter resolved, it now behooves the AIA to actively join with the city in finding means of easing the log-jam of plan check time which the city feels is caused by inadequate plans and specs. We have asked the structural, mechanical and electrical engineers to join us in this endeavor.

We would appreciate your thoughts and efforts to bring this subject to the State Board as a whole. The main purpose of such a committee is to uphold or raise the standards of the professions. If our committee was appointed and sanctioned by the State Board, it would of course, be on a better footing.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt reported on his and Mr. Vanlandingham's attendance at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in San Francisco on July 14-17, 1971. He outlined the new NCARB concept in which a modified professional examination may be written after passing a qualifying exam, given to applicants who have eight years' apprenticeship but who have not received a degree.

Mr. Vanlandingham commented on the plan whereby a degree from an accredited school plus one year apprenticeship would also qualify an applicant to take the modified professional examination.

Both members expressed disagreement with these resolutions which were adopted at the meeting.

Mr. Knickerbocker submitted the following report on his attendance at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners in San Juan, Puerto Rico on August 23-27, 1971:

The 1971 convention proceedings should be available about December 15, 1971. As the only member of the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration in attendance it is not possible to give a detailed report of the meetings. However, there are certain items which may be of interest. Attendance was very good with some boards having as many as five people in attendance.

Roy T. Sessums of the Louisiana Board is to succeed A. L. Bavone as President-Elect.

Constitution & By-Laws

Ten motions amending the constitution and by-laws were presented. These were mostly related to new definition of officers and duties--Executive Secretary changed to Executive Director, Zone Directors changed to Vice-Presidents; flexibility by the Board of Directors concerning the administration of funds; changing the by-laws such that amendment is possible other than at an annual meeting--if it appears the by-laws should be amended the Board of Directors will direct that the amendment be approved by mail ballot. Full detail concerning the amendments will be included in the proceedings.

Model Law Revision

A Model Law for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors was reported and accepted. A copy of the Arizona Code relative to Technical Registration and the Arizona Board By-Laws was delivered to Mr. R. D. Reckert, Chairman of the Committee on Land Surveying. (Insert was to show that a Land Surveyor could be a member of the Arizona Board.)

Western Zone Meeting

Mr. Orland Mayer made a brief report noting that the resolution relating to having NCEE become involved with ECPD concerning engineering curricula which must be accredited had been accepted by the Board of Directors (resolution passed at Coeur d'Alene meeting). An ad-hoc committee of three members of the NCEE-ECPD committee is to be appointed to pursue further definition.

Some discussion was held concerning personal appearance relative to comity. It appears most states are trending away from the requirement of personal audience but have begun to ask for written exams based on the State Law. These exams are being conducted by mail.

The National Officers made usual comment concerning the national activity of NCEE. All emphasized that the purpose is service to the State Boards.

It was again discussed and accepted that the NCEE might pay the expenses of the officers, such as Zone Directors (Vice-Presidents) to the convention and the State Board could then send an additional member. There was a general feeling that at least two people are necessary if the activity of the annual meeting is to be properly covered.

Mr. Morrison of Canada briefly discussed activity concerning a Joint International Committee.

The meeting place for 1972 at Jackson Hole, Wyoming on May 22 and 23 is firm. The arrangements will be completed shortly by a steering committee.

The Western Zone discussed hosting the NCEE Annual Meeting in 1976 and it was agreed that the meeting be held in Tucson, Arizona. The group suggested that Mr. Mayer have the board consider the time to be in late September or October. (The board acted and declared the meeting would be in early August.)

Short discussion was held concerning the bringing of a lay member of the citizens to State Boards and including a "Code of Conduct" into the law.

National Certification

The National Certification Committee met and discussed the procedures for national certification. This discussion was brief and generally involved an increase in use by State Boards. It does appear that something should be done to cause the candidate's record to be more current if it is to be used for the automatic registration by comity for the various state boards. There was discussion concerning the possibility of including other countries when studying the development of new procedures. Much of the discussion included going as far as NCARB has gone.

Some discussion also centered on the appearance of the NCEE certificate and it was concluded that a more presentable certificate could be issued.

The meeting closed with a suggestion that the Board of Directors consider stopping the receipt of applications beginning September 1, 1971, until some policy and procedure for processing applications could be received, updated and revised. (The Board agrees to allow consideration toward refinement of the policy and procedure but does not approve stopping the receipt of applications.)

NCEE-ECPD

In 1965, NCEE adopted a resolution approving formal education of the Professional Engineer of the future have the equivalent of at least one year of advanced level professional education beyond the B.S. degree. A resolution was passed suggesting a National Commission on Accreditation with authorization for ECPD to accredit advanced degree programs as professional degree programs in engineering.

The NCEE-ECPD committee has been given the task to have NCEE become more involved concerning accreditation of engineering curricula (proposal of Western Zone).

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Knickerbocker presented the budget request for 1972-73, as shown on Minute Pages 2941 through 2964, which was approved by the committee, by telephone, on August 18, 1971. It was noted that the Technical Registration Fund is expected to increase substantially during the next two years. It was also noted that funds have not been requested for a full time investigator in 1971-72 or in 1972-73. After some discussion, Mr. Dryden requested that Mr. Knickerbocker act as chairman, pro tem, to permit him to speak as a member. Mr. Dryden expressed the opinion that additional personnel should not be added unless a full time requirement for the service exists. He then resumed the chair and appointed the following ad-hoc committee to:

- 1. Determine the necessity for investigative services,
 - (a) as a permanent employee,
 - (b) on a Professional Services basis as needed.
- 2. To delineate the duties to be performed in either case.
- 3. To recommend revision of the budget request, if desirable.
- 4. To study revision of the renewal fee if receipts at the present rate are expected to greatly exceed requirements.



SCHEDULE 4

PROGRAM DEFINITION, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Goal of the Board of Technical Registration is to provide for the safety, health and welfare of the public as affected by the performance of architects, assayers, engineers, geologists, landscape architects or land surveyors.

The <u>Objectives</u> are to achieve the goal through the promulgation and enforcement of standards of qualification for the individuals practicing those professions.

The <u>Program</u> consists of examination and registration, renewal of licenses, and investigation of violations of the laws. Before registration can be granted by the Board, an applicant must fulfill the requirements for experience and education and submit an application form which qualifies him for a personal audience with an Evaluation Committee when the transcripts, references and record of experience and prior registration in other states have been verified by the office staff. As a part of the personal audience procedure, the applicant takes a written test on Arizona law and Rules of the Board. After reviewing the written application, the Committee interviews the candidate to be sure he understands the Arizona law and to determine his qualifications. The Committee may recommend to the Board that registration be granted with or without examination, that the application be denied, or that the application be reviewed by the whole Board.

When examinations are required, the office arranges their preparation through national or local sources. The National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and the National Council of Engineering Examiners sell prepared examinations, revised twice a year, to most state Boards for architects and engineers-in-training. The more advanced examinations for professional registration are secured by individual purchase for preparation and grading, usually from professors of Arizona universities. The examinations are held three times a year at the universities in Tempe and in Tucson. Proctoring is done by the office staff as far as possible. After the examinations are graded they are tabulated and submitted to the Examination Committee for approval of the grades, and referred to the next Board meeting for confirmation.

Annual renewal of registration is accomplished by use of the computer service in the Finance Department, which maintains the file of registrants and prepares renewal notices. Payments are recorded by the Agency staff.

The enforcement phase of the program depends on investigation of complaints and subsequent action by the Board against registrants as defined by ARS 32-128B, under which a certificate may be revoked or suspended for cause. The Board also cooperates with citizens, professional societies, governmental agencies and the courts in bringing criminal prosecution or injunctive action against persons or firms offering or attempting to practice in violation of the statutes. It is planned to strengthen the enforcement procedures by investigative effort as requested under Professional and Outside Services, but without additional staff at present.

The expenditures for 1970-71 proved to be greater than the appropriation for that year. The major causes were an unforeseen increase in the number of examinations, the design of the system and program for the computer, and overlapping salaries due to the change in executive directors as of May 15, 1971.

To avoid a recurrence of this condition, the estimates for 1971-1972 have been reviewed with knowledge of the actual expenditures in the previous year and with the objective of establishing a sound base from which to construct a realistic lump sum request for 1972-1973, by which the agency program can be effective in attaining its objectives and making further progress toward the goal.

SCHEDULE 12 -- Professional and Outside Services

The <u>COMPUTER</u> at the Finance Department was programmed for the issuance of renewal notices and receipts in 1970-1971. To keep the file current, it is updated to reflect new registrants, changes of address, deceased or lapsed registrants. This is done throughout the year and the renewal notices are produced in October. The amount of \$1,500 requested for this service is an increase of \$200 over 1971-1972. The use of this service has precluded the need for additional clerical staff to handle the increasing workload.

EXAMINATION preparation and grading prices have increased for 1971-1972. The number of examinations written varies with the requirement for applicants to take all, part, or no exams as decided by the Board. Estimates must also provide for permitting repeat exams until the candidate achieves a passing grade. The examination procedure is a vital step in obtaining evidence of satisfactory qualifications. The amount of \$11,700 requested for national and local preparation and grading provides for a 10% increase in price and a 10% increase in volume.

INVESTIGATIONS have been conducted on receipt of major complaints and appropriate action taken in a small number of cases. It is now considered necessary to strengthen this phase of the program to curb the increasing number of violations coming both formally and informally to the attention of this office and to the members of the Board. The use of professional investigators is considered to be an effective approach at this time. The requested amount of \$3,500 is considered as a step to expand this project and result in curtailed violations of the law.

With the recent appointment of a landscape architect, the Board now consists of nine members, appointed from different locations within the State. Board meetings and committee meetings are a vital part of the registration process since final decision on any application is the responsibility of the Board. These meetings involve travel, including staff members if the meeting is outside of Phoenix or travel by Board members to Phoenix meetings if they reside elsewhere.

Staff travel is necessary for examination arrangements and proctoring as the examinations are held in both Tempe and Tucson. Investigation of complaints may result in extensive staff travel and may also require attendance at hearings or court proceedings in other cities.

The estimate of \$4,100 for 1971-72 is based on the above requirements and the increase of \$300 for 1972-73 provides \$200 for additional workload and \$100 for investigative program expansion.

SCHEDULE 14 - TRAVEL - OUT-OF-STATE

At the present time there is considerable pressure by certain groups to lower the standards of experience and other qualifications for registration. The Arizona Board, in conformance with ARS 32-101(A), cannot work in comity with other State boards unless their standards are in reasonable accord with our own.

The most effective influence in this regard is attained by participation of Arizona Board Members at the annual meetings of the national organizations who provide a major part of our examination material. These are the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, the National Council of Engineering Examiners, and the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards. The Architectural and Engineering Boards also have Western Zone Conferences which are very influential with the national councils.

Thus, the need for active participation is now essential for the maintenance of adequate standards. Although all dates and locations for meetings are not yet determined, it is known that there will be three annual meetings at which at least two Board members should participate, and two zone conferences at which two Board members and a staff representative should be present. The amount of \$3,350 is considered necessary to activate this project, beginning in 1971-72, and no increase is requested for 1972-73. The amount does not provide for any contingencies such as unscheduled meetings.

We hereby file a complaint against the firm of Donald B. Schwenn, Architect, Inc., 4524 North 12th Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85014. This firm prepared drawings for the installation of 12 Shuffleboards at our Travel Trailer Park. This drawing was labeled Sheet No. S-1 of job No. 6939G and date issued was June 30, 1970.

Our complaint is as follows:

- Drawing did not indicate certain necessities such as strength of concrete, tolerance, proper finish of playing area: and did not show the tapering of gutters at the correct point.
- 2. Specifications were not prepared.
- 3. Drawing was not properly prepared according to National Shuffleboard Association regulations.

It is therefore requested that action be taken against this Architectural firm.

COMPLAINT - ROADRUNNER LAKE PARKS, INC.

In discussion with Mr. Tannenbaum on June 23, he asserted that the shuffleboard courts are not level, varying 1/16" to 5/8", and that some cracking of the concrete is evident. He, also, stated that the slope at the back of the courts does not conform with National Shuffleboard Association regulations. Further, the contractor has offered to assume 1/3 of the cost of rectification by grinding, but the architect has refused to assume any part of that cost.

Mr. Gerald L. Clark, registered architect #6069, visited the office June 24th at my request, representing the firm of Schwenn and Clark, Architects, Phoenix, Arizona.

Mr. Clark's stated position is that they were requested only to supply a drawing from which shuffleboard courts had been previously constructed for another customer, and that Roadrunner undertook to have their contractor build the courts without supervision or inspection by Schwenn and Clark; and had themselves prepared the bases for the concrete. Mr. Clark furnished me with a drawing labeled Sheet No. S-1 of Job No. 6939G.

Since this preliminary investigation has indicated no evidence of gross negligence, incompetence or misconduct, it is recommended that no further action be taken with regard to the Roadrunner complaint.

NEW BUSINESS - Cont'd.

The Executive Director reported on a complaint received from Donovan Seaboch, Architect, against Logan E. Campbell, Architect.

The complaint was withdrawn by Mr. Seaboch after a meeting was held at his request. The Executive Director was instructed not to permit meetings with contesting parties present and to report complaints to the Chairman of the Board before investigating.

Mrs. Stirley Cantor, Assistant Attorney General, reported that Mr. Mark Harrison, attorney for Technical Advisory Service, Inc., was preparing a procedure for activities of that company in conformance with the Code.

A letter from George C. Leiphart, Director, Planning Division of the Department of Finance, was presented. It informed the Board of the proposed office space in the new Occupational Licensing Building and that the architectural firm of Schwenn and Clark & Assoc., Inc., would meet with this agency on their specific needs. It was directed that the Executive Director inform Mr. Wyatt and Mr. Vanlandingham when the meeting would be held with this architectural firm.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Dr. Newlin reported on his attendance in San Francisco at the Engineer's Council for Professional Development meeting. He stated there were several things that happened which will not affect this Board immediately but in the long run it will. It was the first time ECPD has taken any solid action in 15 years. The committee voted to accredit engineering institutions at two levels, basic degrees and advanced degrees. They voted to use the term Bachelor and Master which essentially means we will have an accredited curricula at a given institution with a Masters' degree and some with a Bachelor's degree. This trend will see more engineering students having a professional school of engineering comparable to law or medicine. The committee also decided to accredit two and four-year degree curricula in technology. An indication of future requirements of registration for applicants would be they take all four parts of the examination upon graduation and after four years of actual experience they would appear before their peers to evaluate their experience for professional registration.

Chairman Dryden accepted the above report of Dr. Newlin.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Knickerbocker reported that since the budget for fiscal year 1972-73 had been presented to the Finance Commissioner, several developments had arisen, as shown on Minute Page 2982. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the recommendations as listed on the Budget Report be approved. Motion carried.

BUDGET REPORT

Data Processing.

The renewal notices for 1972 were not accurately prepared by the Data processing Division of the Finance Department.

After several discussions, assurance has been given by new personnel in that division that the project has now been correctly programmed and that the job will be done properly for the ensuing year at a cost of approximately \$1,750. The cost of \$1,194 in 1970-71, from which an estimate of \$1,300 was made for 1971-72 and \$1,500 was requested for 1972-73.

Mr. Alan Carroll, the budget analyst assigned to this agency, has informed us that he will increase the \$1,500 figure to \$2,500 for 1972-73, as a result of his discussion with the data processing division. This will change the total for Professional and Outside Services from \$16,650 to \$17,650.

Travel - Out-of-State

Mr. Carroll has informed us that the Budget Division will recommend \$2,200 for 1972-73, a reduction of \$1,150 from the requested amount.

Annual Report

Purchasing Division has a low bid of \$4,330 for princing the 50th must Report. The cost of the 49th report was \$3,500, the estimate for 1971-72 was \$3,800, and the request for 1972-73 was \$3,800. Mr. Carroll has indicated that the Budget Division will recommend an amount of \$5,000 for 1972-73 if the request is revised.

Equipment & Other Items

The request of \$1,634 will not be recommended. \$1,300 was requested as a contingency to cover items not in the building contract. Mr. Carroll informs us that this will be done by Public Buildings Maintenance if required. The item of \$334 for dictating equipment will be disallowed.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the Board will acquire examination information, at a minimum amount of expense, and distribute it to the various professional societies. Motion carried.

Letter from Samuel T. Balen, Director of Professional Services of N.C.A.R.B., regarding personal interviews for reciprocal registration, as shown on Minute Page 2987, was presented. The Board directed that his letter be acknowledged and inform Mr. Balen of their feelings in this regard.

Letter from Executive Director of National Council of Engineering Examiners regarding distribution of Typical Examination Questions, as shown on Minute Pages 2988 and 2989, was presented.

The Chairman directed that instead of completing the authorization form we forward a letter stating the the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration has no objection to the National Council selling these typical questions to anyone who wishes them. Also, request that the typical questions they furnish are correct for both questions and answers.

Letter from Professor J. E. Lawver, University of Minnesota, requesting past examinations in mining and metallurgical engineering, was presented as shown on Minute Page 2990. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the office inform Prof. Lawver the examinations he requested are confidential and the Board does not distribute restricted examinations. Motion carried.

Letter from State Senator Sandra O'Connor, regarding registration requirements for landscape architects, was presented as shown on Minute Page 2991. Since the intent of her letter was not quite clear, the Chairman delegated Mr. Bowlsby to visit with Senator O'Connor.

Letter from Michael Andrews, an EIT applicant, was presented to the Board as shown on Minute Page 2992. In reply to his letter, it was suggested that he be informed that our EIT, Parts 1 and 2, are national examinations determined by a national group so the make up of our Board has nothing to do with the content of the examination, and it deals with the fundamentals of engineering generally and not to a specific proficiency. Also, we appreciate his comments and if he has any further questions, to contact Mr. Knickerbocker who is an electrical engineering member of the Board.

Prior to the identification of the Uniform Examinations as being prepared by the National Council of Engineering Examiners, the Uniform Examination Committee of NCEE restricted the sale of pamphlets containing typical questions from recent examinations to Member Boards only. NCEE responded to every request from Professional Organizations, Refresher Course Coordinators, Libraries and interested individuals that the typical question pamphlets were only available from the State Board where the party resided.

These procedures were a burden on the Member Boards as well as the National Council Office and the Board of Directors of NCEE at its November 2nd Meeting directed revision to permit direct distribution, if approved by the individual State Boards. NCEE is therefore requesting permission to distribute its current pamphlets on typical questions from the Fundamentals of Engineering and the Principles and Practice of Engineering, see copies attached, to all who request same within your jurisdiction.

Should you choose to permit such a distribution NCEE will only do so if the attached authorization is on file in the National Council Office. The absence of such an authorization will indicate lack of approval and requests for pamphlets will be forwarded to you for information or action.

Persons and organizations requesting shipment of typical question pamphlots will pay more than NCEE is charging its Member Boards so as to insure no cost to NCEE Membership and a minimum order of \$2.50, 10 copies of either publication, has been established.

The Officers of NCEE feel that the above will permit a more equitable distribution of information to engineering students and registration applicants.

A constituent has requested me to look into the matter of the registration requirements for landscape architects and has called my attention to the provision of A.R.S. \$ 32-122 and \$ 32-144. A.R.S. \$ 32-122 requires as a prerequisite of registration as a landscape architect eight years of architectural practice in that or related field with the possibility of substituting a year's study for a year's actual practice, up to a maximum of five years of study. A.R.S. \$ 32-144.A.(4) and (5) allows for certain exemptions to registration requirements in designing a building, which exceptions appear to apply only to architects, engineers, and surveyors without reference to any landscape architectural services.

I would appreciate it if you would bring this matter to the attention of your Board and inquire whether the requirements of these two sections, as applied to landscape architects, are possibly too restrictive. Your advice will be welcome.

- 3. The question was posed as to what minimum age an applicant can be for land surveying registration? It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Bowlsby that the question of a minimum age limit for assayers and land surveyors be referred to the Rules and By-Laws Committee. Motion carried.

In previous years, it has been our experience that several state departments have completed their legislative programs and introduced into the Legislature their legislation toward the final day for introduction of bills. This provides the committees and members of the Legislature with insufficient time to properly consider the merits of the proposed legislation.

This year we are insisting that all state agencies have legislation prefiled as soon as possible for the purpose of receiving consideration by committees and membership before the legislative session officially begins. We recognize some legislation will be offered after the session commences, but we would appreciate your co-operation in minimizing the number of introductions after the session starts and help eliminate any last minute introductions in the last couple of days.

For your information, all committee chairmen are being informed that we have notified state departments of this request. Please make contact with the necessary standing committee and its chairman as soon as possible to expedite introductions of your requested bills.

The committee met in the office of the Board at 9:00 A.M., October 29, 1971, with the following present:

- C. W. Newlin, Chairman

The committee was charged by C. W. Dryden, Chairman of the Board, to consider the following items:

- 1. Determine the necessity for investigative services,
 - (a) as a permanent employee,
 - (b) on a Professional Services basis as needed.
- 2. To delineate the duties to be performed in either case.
- 3. To recommend revision of the budget request, if desirable.
- 4. To study revision of the renewal fee if receipts at the present rate are expected to greatly exceed requirements.

The committee agrees that the Board should increase its investigative activities, particularly in the areas of negligence and incompetence of registrants and where non-registrants may be guilty of misdemeanors through violations of the law.

To accomplish this, it is desirable to use additional investigative services. The committee recommends that a part-time investigator be engaged to work as directed by the Board thru the executive director. Dependent on negotiations with the individual, his prior commitments, and State regulations, the investigator may be either an independent contractor or a temporary employee. In either case the investigator will not occupy a desk in the Board office nor will he be provided with a vehicle.

Funds provided for this purpose under Professional Services during the 1971-72 fiscal year will permit average monthly payments of \$300, assuming that he may be engaged for 6 months. The budget request for 1972-73, \$3500, is

also adequate for services at substantially the same level.

- 5. It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that we cease to grant Engineer-in-Training certificates without examination. Motion grant Engineer-in-Training certificates without examination. Motion carried with one abstention. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we reconsider our previous action. Motion carried. Discussion followed and it was explained we waive Parts 1 and 2 of the examination if a graduate of an ECPD school for professional registration but this is to cease granting certificates to the Engineer-in-Training without an examination. - 9. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we do not discuss the use of terms such as Safety Engineer, Fire Protection Engineer, etc., and move on to the next item on the agenda. Motion carried.
- 10. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the Executive Director be advised to inform the applicant when he accepts the receipt of his application and application fee that the Board meets four times a year and the appropriate committee meets four times a year, and we cannot predict when his application has been completely processed, but it will be considered at the first opportunity the committee meets. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS - Cont'd.

Deadline dates for submittal of examination or re-examination fees to be received 30 days prior to the examination date was requested. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Place that this be referred to the Office Procedures Committee. Motion carried.

Letter from Mr. William H. Cooke of Cain, Nelson, Wares & Cooke, was presented for the Board's information regarding Mr. Allan Steppe, an architectural applicant taking the written examinations and an employee of Mr. Cooke's firm. The Board suggested that the Executive Director contact Mr. Cooke and explain the facts as to what initiated the discussion between the Executive Director and Mr. Steppe.

Dear Mr. Drewry:

A conference was held today with Senator Sandra D. O'Connor, as directed by the Board at its last meeting December 10, 1971, concerning a constituent's interest in registration requirements for landscape architects 32-122 and 33-144. The constituent, Mr. Leighton Tom Wade, attorney-at-law, was also present. Mr. Wade's son, currently a graduate student at the University of Arizona, prompted the inquiry when it was determined that he could not practice the profession of Landscape Architecture upon graduation until he had fulfilled three years of practical experience under the direct supervision of a registered landscape architect. It was his contention that the three to four years practical experience requirement was overly restrictive when compared to the registration requirements found in other states which have registration requirements for landscape architects. (A copy of the research made on this subject by Miss O'Connor's office is attached hereto.)

The night before the conference I received a telephone call from Mr. Guy Green, Professor of Landscape Architecture at the University of Arizona, briefing me on the subject to be discussed with Senator O'Connor. He informed me that his main concern and that of Mr. Wade and his son, is the minimum age (25 years)

and experience requirements provided under ARS 32-122. They would like to see the age requirements lowered to 21 years, and practical experience requirements waived for landscape architectural graduates upon receiving their B.S. degree from an accredited school; an accredited school being that approved by the American Society of Landscape Architects (national professional organization).

Professor Green pointed out that many of the graduating landscape architects leave the state to enter private practice elsewhere, due to this stringent requirement and the lack of working opportunities for employment under a local registrant.

In summary, it was his position that by waiving the experience and age requirements the state and general public would benefit both directly and indirectly by:

- (a) Allowing the young graduate to create his own working opportunity in a professional field not now being adequately served.
- (b) Retaining and using to good advantage the educational investment the state has in the young graduate; and
- (c) Helping to create a more livable and satisfying environment, now in jeopardy, by the state's rapid population growth.

The following day at the conference Senator O'Connor covered the same points that were discussed with Professor Green, and also concurred with his opinion. Senator O'Connor advised me that she was immediately going to sponsor a bill to change the Code as it now stands by waiving the practical experience requirements and lowering the age requirement to 21 years for landscape architects graduating from an accredited school. She suggested that I report this information to the Board as well as to my colleagues, and Senator O'Connor said that she will keep me informed as to the status of the proposed new bill.

I disagreed with Senator O'Connor's statement that the "safety, health and welfare" of the public was not directly affected by our profession or by waiving the practical experience and age requirements. I pointed out that I, as well as many other practicing

landscape architects are frequently commissioned to prepare comprehensive community plans involving the proper use of land, land use controls; prepare major streets and highway plans; parks, schools and recreational plans, etc., all concerning the public's safety, health and welfare.

I will bring this matter before the local Arizona Association of Landscape Architects at their next meeting to be held later this month.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt reported on his attendance at the Western Conference of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards' meeting in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on March 30-April 1, 1972. One item discussed at this meeting was the interprofessional practice by architects and engineers, and there has been a resolution in Florida which covers most states allowing professions within the practice if he is competent in that particular field. Arizona seems to be in the minority rather than the majority by establishing human occupancy as a guideline for interprofessional practice.

At this meeting, the Western Conference adopted new seismic requirements by deleting the seismic problem and enlarging the treatise requirements.

Mr. Wyatt pointed out the new examination procedure for Architects would be discussed at the National meeting in Seattle, Washington, and in order for Arizona applicants to take this examination as it is presently presented to be adopted by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, there will be some changes required in our Rules and By-Laws, and requested the Board to authorize the Architectural Evaluation Committee to review these

new examinations and work with Rules and By-Laws Committee to consider this new examination procedure changing the present rule. The Chairman authorized the Committee to proceed.

Mr. Wyatt reported on new legislative action in California requiring the professionally registered be reviewed and their experience requirements updated at the time of their renewal.

The Chairman accepted the report by Mr. Wyatt and directed the Architectural Evaluation Committee to determine the seismic requirements of Arizona applicants.

The Western Zone Meeeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners at Jackson, Wyoming, on May 21-23, 1972, was attended by Chairman Dryden, Mr. Knickerbocker and the Executive Director, Mr. Drewry, and the text of this meeting was presented as follows:

At the after dinner meeting on May 21, the Land Surveyor's Committee met and was chaired by Oregon Board Member, John B. Gearhart. It seems that Oregon has set up new requirements for registration which almost equal professional engineer registration. Mr. Dryden questioned Mr. Gearhart regarding Arizona applicants and found that they will have to take at least a four hour examination in their general laws, not their code governing registration. Mr. Gearhart admitted these were not codified and readily available for study. Seems as though this attitude and requirement is being fostered by the academic community.

There were 47 representatives from the Western Zone and Canadian guests were well represented.

President Bavone reported that 50 states are using the E.I.T. examination and 46 are using the professional examination. In December, 1971, 6200 E.I.T. exams were written and 2100 professional exams. In April, 1972, 17000 EIT exams were requested, and 6000 professional. The President also mentioned that the Engineer Council for Professional Development visitations to schools may include a local Board member, and that certification of engineers is not recommended to be substitute for registration.

Executive Director Walter Edelblut stated that a book containing all uniform exams from 1965 through 1971 will be available in September, and that a report on National Certification will be presented to the Annual Meeting in August. He presented slides giving statistics of uniform examinations.

Roland Allwork and Leslie Gates of NCARB and NCEE, representing the Committee on Interprofessional Relations, have visted all regions to explain their approach to resolution of problems concerning architects and engineers. The committee holds that no legal definition of the two proficiencies can be acceptable to all, and suggests competency as a better measure. It was suggested that rules of professional conduct be adopted by the Boards, but only those rules strictly in the public interest and not those in the interest of the professionals. E.g. "No individual shall practice or offer to practice unless he is competent by education and experience in that field or has engaged someone who is." It was reported that Daniel Boone, NCARB President, has stated that the identity of the prime will be decided in the marketplace.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE - Continued

The Nomination Committee proposed Orland C. Mayer of Idaho and Orlie O. Phillips of Colorado as President Elect of NCEE and Vice President and Director of Western Zone, respectively.

Reports were given on continuing education in California, and on technology programs by Logan Muir and George Sutton.

Site Committee selected for 1973 to meet in a suitable location in Arizona at a date and place selected later. Mr. Knickerbocker was a member of the committee.

Dr. Newlin reported on his attendance as an official observer for National Council of Engineering Examiners at the Engineering Technology Committee ECPD meeting held June 15-17, 1972, in Lubbock, Texas. Accreditation action was taken on the curricula from approximately 20 different institutions, involving both 2-year and 4-year technology, that had previously been visited by accreditation teams. A recommendation that an NCEE representative be included on all accreditation visits was made and since this would place a burden on the time demands of the local boards, I suggested that if an individual board wished to participate in the accreditation of technology curricula in their state, they should contact the institutions to be evaluated, and have the institutions invite board members to be observers during the accreditation visits. The technology committee agreed to this procedure.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

The approximate amounts required for Fiscal Year 1973-1974 was presented. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that Minute Page 3060, subject to the Fiscal Year 1971-72 becoming factual, be submitted by September first to the Commissioner of Finance, with the estimated monetary requirements for the next two fiscal years. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director presented the report shown on Minute Page 3061 and the Cash Flow Report #4, as shown on Minute Page 3062.

Estimates were reported to show that renewal fees of \$15 or \$10 would result in revenue of \$102,000 or \$77,000, respectively. With expenses approximately \$95,000, the \$15 renewal fee is in line with current requirements. However, our year end balance will leave approximately \$50,000 in the reserve fund. The Chairman referred this excessive reserve fund to the Rules and By-Laws and Legislative Committees for study and possible action.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

As directed at a previous Board meeting, Mr. Girand investigated the question of a displayed sign by a designer and reported as follows: "There is a sign in the window of Canyon Realty Office, which is across the street from the Oak Creek Grocery Store, stating Don Bloodgood, P. O. Box 777, Sedona, Telephone 282-7354, designer not an architect."

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion was requested on the propriety of a teacher in a review course being permitted to participate in the preparation of examinations. It was the consensus of the Board that the questions to be used on an examination are selected by the Examination Committee from those prepared by a number of individuals, that it is appropriate for teachers of review courses to submit questions to be used at the discretion of the Board, and that the present procedure be continued.

Also, discussed was reference material allowed by the examinees, and the Board determined that the examinees may bring any reference material to the examinations.

The Board discussed the term "designer" and it was determined that the Board has no jurisdiction over designers and the term can be used as long as it is not coupled with the words architect or engineer.

Correspondence, dating from March 28 to May 3, from James L. Merry was discussed at length. Since the Board has established human occupancy as a guideline for whether it is to be architectural or engineering work, a determination of who is to be the prime contractor was the inquiry of Mr. Merry. Mr. Knickerbocker felt that if architectural practice and engineering practice could be defined perhaps there would be a solution for such future inquiries. Since the Board could not arrive at such a definition or decision, the Chairman appointed Mr. Vanlandingham, Mr. Wyatt, Mr. Girand and Mr. Wallace to work with the Assistant Attorney General in the preparation of an appropriate response to Mr. Merry's request. It was suggested that Mrs. Cantor rough draft a letter and call the meeting together convenient to the committee members. Mrs. Cantor stated that when she contacted the City Attorney regarding plans being stamped by engineers to advise him that the Board had established human occupancy as a guideline, the City Attorney wanted to know the definition of what is architecture and what is engineering as the permit division had been approving plans as long as they were in accordance with the public's health, safety and welfare. The Chairman concluded that when this committee had resolved a reply for Mr. Merry, it would also resolve this definition for the City Attorney.

A complaint from Donald M. Wiley regarding Mr. Burden, Land Surveyor, was presented to the Board. It was felt that this was an ethics problem and the Chairman directed the Executive Director to refer this letter to American Congress on Surveying and Mapping, Arizona Section, stating this letter has come to our attention and we feel it is a society matter, with a carbon copy to Mr. Wiley.

Mr. Ben Dibble had furnished for the Board's information a letter and business card of Tel Engineering Services. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we recommend the filing of a complaint with the appropriate County Attorney or hold a hearing depending upon what is found from the investigation. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS - Continued

Photographs of a sign in Lake Havasu City displayed by R. B. Williams and Associates, Inc., Engineers and Architects, Gordon J. McCulloch, P.E., Assoc., was presented to the Board. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Girand that this is in compliance with our understanding of the law. Motion carried. The Chairman referred Rule IV, B(3), to the Rules and By-Laws Committee since the Assistant Attorney General stated it may be in conflict with A.R.S. 32-141.

A letter from the President of the Central Chapter of American Institute of Architects, Mr. Dwight Busby, regarding Don Woods of Sedona, Arizona, together with photographs and copies of the yellow pages of the telephone directory of that area, was presented. Mr. Vanlandingham had heard that Mr. Woods was going to stay within the \$50,000 limits but he had opened an office in Sedona and on his signs advertised as an architect. The only complaint is his advertising as an architect. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the Board file complaint with the appropriate county attorney to cause Mr. Woods to refrain from calling himself an architect. Motion carried.

A sworn complaint together with exhibits from Robert Levine against Cadmus Goss (Desert Surveyors) was presented. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we hold a formal hearing in this matter at the next regular Board meeting. Motion carried.

A sworn complaint together with exhibits from M. J. Buck Brown against J. B. Holmquist was presented. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we have a formal hearing in regard to this complaint at the next Board meeting or as appropriate. Motion carried.

Authorization was unanimously approved for anyone who wished to attend the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in Seattle, Washington, on June 27-July 1, 1972, and the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners in Seattle, Washington, on August 21-25, 1972. Mr. Dryden and Mr. Knickerbocker will be the accredited delegates to the N.C.E.E. meeting.

- 2. In-Training certificates, none.

The Rules and By-Laws Committee reports the following revisions as proposed by the Architectural Evaluation Committee at a meeting held on Wednesday, september 6, 1972:

RULE I. GENERAL RULES

A. Applications, General

3. Architectural applicants required to submit a treatise on seismic forces will not be scheduled for evaluation until the treatise has been submitted, satisfactorily graded and accepted by the Evaluation Committee.

RULE II. EXAMINATIONS

A. General Rules, Applicants for Registration

Initial Examination

1. Applicants for registration held for written examination as a result of initial Board action on their original application or re-application will be denied their application for registration and forfeit all application and examination fees if they fail to take their first scheduled written examination following notification of their being held for written examination. However, the Board may waive this rule when an applicant who is unable to take the first scheduled written examination notifies the Board at least ten days prior to the scheduled examination date and requests an extension in writing. Applicants for registration held for written examination pursuant to this rule, who have been granted an extension on the first scheduled written examination and who fail to take the next regularly scheduled written examination offered by the Board, shall have their application for registration denied.

Re-Examination

- 2. Applicants for registration who take the written examination pursuant to Rule II, A(1), and fail to achieve a passing grade will be allowed to re-examine. To be re-examined, applicants for registration must request re-examination thirty days prior to the next scheduled written examination date, by letter, and pay the scheduled re-examination fee for each part of the examination on which a passing grade was not achieved. Applicants who fail to request re-examination and pay the scheduled re-examination fees for two consecutive examination periods shall have their application for registration denied.
- 5. Written examinations will be given at a time and place established by the Board. The Board shall select and publish the examination dates and locations at least 90 days prior to the date selected.
- B. General Rules, Applicants for Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, Landscape Architect-in-Training
- 3. Applicants for Architect-in-Training will be permitted to take the Architect-in-Training examination after graduation from an accredited architectural school. The graduates from an accredited architectural school

must obtain the signature of the Dean of the College of Architecture on their Architect-in-Training application form. Applicants without college degrees from an accredited architectural school desiring to enter the Architect-in-Training program will be permitted to apply after five years of architectural training under a registered architect by submitting an application to the Board bearing the approval and signature of the current employer. Permission to enter the in-training program, upon application, will be granted by the Architectural Evaluation Committee after review to determine that the applicant has the experience as outlined in the current standards of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in architectural work of a character satisfactory to the Board.

- 4. Architect-in-Training examinations will be given at a time and place designated by the Board. Application for the in-training examination and certification from graduates of an accredited architectural school must be received in the office of the Board at least thirty days prior to the scheduled date of the examination. Application for the in-training examination and certification from non-graduates requesting examination and certification under Rule I,B(3) must be received in the office of the Board at least sixty days prior to the date of the scheduled examination.
- 6. An Architect-in-Training may repeat any of the three sections of the Architect-in-Training examination. When the required years of satisfactory training have been attained, he will be given credit for all parts passed and may apply for professional registration. Upon action by the Board, he may then be held for the professional examination.
- 7. If an Engineer-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Fundamentals of Engineering will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 8. At the time of application for professional registration, credit will be given for Fundamentals of Engineering to any graduate of an ECPD accredited engineering curriculum.
- 9. If a Geologist-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Basic Geology will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 10. If a Landscape Architect-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for History and Theory; Planting, Design and Identification; and Landscape Architectural Design will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
 - 11. All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance.

- C. · Context of Written Examinations
- 2. Architect-in-Training -- The applicant is required to pass the first major section of the examination in architecture.
- 3. Architecture -- There are two major sections to the examination in architecture; namely, the equivalency examination and the professional examination. The equivalency examination consists of three parts which are Construction, Theory and Practice (8 hours); History, Theory and planning (2 hours); Design (10 hours). Each of these three sections may be repeated if a passing grade is not achieved. Construction, Theory and practice consists of three indivisible parts which are Structural; Construction Technology and Administration; and Environmental Control Systems. The professional examination is of 16 hours duration and may be repeated in total if a passing grade is not achieved. It consists of four indivisible parts which are Environmental Analysis; Architectural Programming; Design and Technology; and Construction. A passing grade of 75 percent will be required on each part of the examination.

RULE IV. PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

B. A.R.S. 32-141

3. The principal of the firm or officer of the corporation residing in Arizona (Rule IV, B(1) shall be assigned to the principal Arizona office of the firm or corporation. This principal may, at his discretion, operate other Arizona offices of the firm or corporation provided, however, that each office has in it a person registered under this Chapter. This regulation shall be interpreted to exempt only offices established to observe construction for conformance with contract documents and design.



REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Vanlandingham stated that at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in Seattle, Washington, June 27-July 1, 1972, primary discussion was the implementation of the new exams. The equivalency examination would be first used in June, 1973, and the professional examination in December, 1973. All states accepted the new examinations but New York. Mr. Vanlandingham will participate in the writing of the national examination.

Mr. Wyatt reported that one of the major topics was discussion by members of the Interprofessional Council on Registration within its efforts to resolve problems common to the design professions.

Mr. Knickerbocker reported on his attendance at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners in Seattle, Washington, August 21-25, 1972. He stated that quite a movement for national certification was being made with very close format to the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

Les Gates reported to the meeting that the Interprofessional Council on Registration has developed rules for professional conduct as a suggestion for individual boards to incorporate in their Rules and By-Laws.

Mr. Dryden suggested that "Suggested Model Rules of Professional Conduct for adoption by State Registration Boards" be referred to the Rules and By-Laws Committee for discussion.

Mr. Knickerbocker stated the Western Zone meeting will be held in Phoenix May 6-8, 1973, and the National meeting in 1976 will be held in Tucson, the dates being August 14-16, 1976.

The budget submitted to the Commissioner of Finance for Fiscal Year 1973-1974, as required by September 1, 1972, is as shown on Minute Pages 3095 through 3114.



ACCOMPLISHMENTS, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

To be assured that applicants for registration are satisfactorily qualified, the Board and/or its evaluation and examination committees have held twenty-four meetings throughout the year. This involved the selection of examination questions, the review of 1,343 examination grades, the appraisal of 755 applications and the granting of 610 registrations. Complaints during the year were resolved without formal hearings although two hearings have already been held in 1972-1973.

GOALS:

To provide for the safety, health and welfare of the public as affected by the performance of architects, assayers, engineers, geologists, landscape architects or land surveyors.

OBJECTIVES:

The maintenance and improvement of standards of qualification, efficiency in issuing renewals, and enforcement of regulatory provisions under the Code. It is planned to continue the program as detailed on Schedule 4 of the Budget Request for 1972-1973, copy included on Page 4.

SCHEDULE 4

PROGRAM DEFINITION, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Goal of the Board of Technical Registration is to provide for the safety, health and welfare of the public as affected by the performance of architects, assayers, engineers, geologists, landscape architects or land surveyors.

The Objectives are to achieve the goal through the promulgation and enforcement of standards of qualification for the individuals practicing those professions.

The Program consists of examination and registration, renewal of licenses, and investigation of violations of the laws. Before registration can be granted by the Board, an applicant must fulfill the requirements for experience and education and submit an application form which qualifies him for a personal audience with an Evaluation Committee when the transcripts, references and record of experience and prior registration in other states have been verified by the office staff. As a part of the personal audience procedure, the applicant takes a written test on Arizona law and Rules of the Board. After reviewing the written application, the Committee interviews the candidate to be sure he understands the Arizona law and to determine his qualifications. The Committee may recommend to the Board that registration be granted with or without examination, that the application be denied, or that the application be reviewed by the whole Board.

When examinations are required, the office arranges their preparation through national or local sources. The National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and the National Council of Engineering Examiners sell prepared examinations, revised twice a year, to most state Boards for architects and engineers-in-training. The more advanced examinations for professional registration are secured by individual purchase for preparation and grading, usually from professors of Arizona universities. The examinations are held three times a year at the universities in Tempe and in Tucson. Proctoring is done by the office staff as far as possible. After the examinations are graded they are tabulated and submitted to the Examination Committee for approval of the grades, and referred to the next Board meeting for confirmation.

Annual renewal of registrants and prepares renewal.

The enforcement phase of the program depends on investigation of complaints and
Board against registrants as defined by ARS 32-128B, under which a certificate may be revoked or suspended for cause. The Board also cooperates with citizens, professional societies, governmental agencies and the courts in the criminal prosecution or injunctive action against persons or firms offering or attempting to practice

The is planned to strengthen the enforcement procedures by investigative effort without additional staff at present.

SCHEDULE 6 - SUMMARY

Actual expenditures during 1971-1972 were somewhat less than the estimated total because complaints against violators were not of a nature to require special investigators, travel, or the conduct of formal hearings. The Board considers this to be an unusual condition and has requested that funds be provided for these purposes whenever necessary to fulfill the procedures outlined under A.R.S. 32-128. For example, two formal hearings have already been held in 1972-1973.

The cost of examinations increased 20% in 1971-1972 and this rate is estimated to increase to a rate of 23% in 1972-1973 and again in 1973-1974. This is due to the anticipated increase in applications and the fact that the price of architectural exams will double beginning in June of 1973, as the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards has completely revised the exam structure for architects.

Operating Expenditures are expected to increase in relation to the additional applications, examinations and registrations; all of which cause extra expense in communications and office supplies.

A small amount of furniture has been requested for effectiveness of the separate room provided for the use of Board members in the Occupational License Building.

TRAVEL

Actual in-State travel was lower than estimated in 1971-1972 because the amount required for investigations was small. However, a contingent amount should be provided since the necessity for investigative travel depends on the location and nature of the suspected violation of the law.

Out-of-State travel was greater than the amount requested due to the locations at which the national meetings were held. Our Board members are concerned with the continuing effort of National Councils to lower examination standards and other requirements for registration. About 50% of our applicants are residents in other states and expect to be registered under A.R.S. 32-126 without further examination. This can only be done if standards in other states are equivalent to those of Arizona. For this reason, the Board members find it necessary to attend the meetings of the National Councils and exert all possible influence toward maintaining the standards as required by A.R.S. 32-101, A. Location of the meetings in 1973-1974 has not yet been decided by the National Councils. Authority for this participation is stated under A.R.S. 32-106,C.

PROFESSIONAL AND OUTSIDE SERVICES

Cost of the computer service for issuance of renewal notices has been estimated by EDP as \$2,500 for 1972-73 and hopefully this will be adequate for 1973-74.

Cost of examinations depends on the number given and the price. The increase in number of engineering exams in 1971-1972 over the previous year was 21%, and 29% for architectural exams. The price of all exams is expected to increase by a nominal amount except that the price of architectural exams will be doubled, effective in June, 1973. This has been caused by a complete revision of the exam structure by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

Complaints of violation of the registration laws are brought to the attention of the Board either informally or by formal complaint. In accordance with A.R.S. 32-128, the Board considers it necessary to provide funds for professional investigations in event the violations are such as to require this service.

A meeting of the Interprofessional Relations Committee was held in the office of the Board at 3:00 P.M. on Thursday, September 7, 1972.

Members present were: M. L. Vanlandingham, Ralph L. Wyatt, John Girand and Robert G. Wallace

Mr. Vanlandingham acted as Chairman of the meeting.

After a brief discussion of the scope of the problems to be discussed, the following motion was made by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Wyatt:

To declare a moratorium on interprofessional practice disputes pitting design professionals against one another publicly.

Motion carried.

In connection with the construction of a certain elementary school for which the Nogales School Board engaged a contractor who subsequently selected an architect, a discussion was held concerning Mr. Merry's letter dated May 3, 1972, in which he stated that, "unfortunately Section 32-142 of the Code is not sufficiently clear in terms of binding a public agency to employ an architect."

The following motion was made by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Wyatt:

The Attorney General be requested to give an opinion of the legality of a public agency to select a contractor to design, build and supervise such a structure.

Motion carried.

With regard to the Hi-Corbett field project in which Rod Gomez and Associates engaged Architect One to do the architectural work, the following motion was made by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Girand:

It is the perogative of the client to select and designate the prime professional and to approve the collaborating professional selected for his project.

Motion carried.

After a thorough discussion on the subject of the practice of engineering and architecture by registrants under Arizona law, it was the opinion of the committee that no firm guidelines should be adopted at this time.

Mr. Girand informed the meeting that two members of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association had been invited to attend the Board meeting on September 15th. The opinion was expressed that the dates of the Board meetings should receive wider publicity.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 P.M.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS - Cont'd.

Mr. Vanlandingham and Mr. Girand discussed the legality of school boards hiring a contractor to build school buildings and the contractor then to hire an architect to design the building.

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Dryden that using proper verbage acquire from the attorney general a formal opinion relative to the legality of a public agency to select a contractor to design, build and supervise such a structure. Motion carried.

On the report regarding Hi-Corbett field project, the following motion was made by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden:

"It is the policy of the Board that it is the prerogative of the client to select and designate the prime professional and to approve the collaborating professionals selected for his project."

Motion carried with Mr. Vanlandingham abstaining.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the Executive Director consult with the Attorney General and draft a letter in answer to the letter of Mr. Merry in light of the action taken by this Board and their aforementioned motion. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Board establish no firm guidelines at this time. Motion carried.

Investigation of Tel-Engineering Services, ad directed by the Board at the June meeting, resulted in the letter as shown on Minute Page 3118. Mr. Drewry explained that this company works for the telephone company and does not do engineering. It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Girand that the investigation of Tel-Engineering Services be dismissed. Motion carried with Mr. Knickerbocker abstaining.

At the June meeting, the Board directed the filing of a complaint with the appropriate county attorney regarding Don Woods of Sedona, Arizona. Further investigation by the office of the Board resulted in the letter as shown on Minute Page 3119 being written to Mr. Don Woods, and also reported to Dwight L. Busby, President, Central Arizona Chapter, AIA, who replied as shown on Minute Page 3120.

Mr. Wyatt remarked that the ever increasing use of the title "engineer" or "architect" when it implies professional service is clearly prohibited by our code of registration. It is my opinion that such use will continue to increase and become "custom and tradition" unless we take an appropriate stand with regard to the last sentence on page one of the Code. It appears that "plant engineering" and "operating engineering" are established by custom and tradition, as was "golf course architect" prior to our registration of Landscape Architects (Court of Appeals, Jackling vs Snyder, 3-11-66 page 63, paragraph 3). However, Zeno's Electrical Contracting & Engineering Co., Inc., implies a professional service, which use of the term is not established as custom and tradition. He pleads the excuse that he does not charge for the service. This is not a valid excuse, per State vs Beadle, Supreme Court 5-28-58, page 217, first paragraph. Appropriate steps should be taken to stop this use of terms.

At the regular meeting of the Board in June, it was reported that you are listed as an architect in the yellow pages of the Sedona telephone directory and in the Sedona-Oak Creek Chamber of Commerce directory, and that you had a sign in front of your office building, bearing the word architect.

As a result of an investigation which the Board requested, it was found that you have changed your sign and that it now reads, "houses designed and built by Don Woods and Red Phillips." You have also stated during our telephone conversation of July 20, 1972, that you have ordered your listing as an architect to be removed from the yellow pages of the telephone directory and the Chamber of Commerce directory, and that you are not offering to practice architecture by advertising or any other means.

In order that you may fully understand the seriousness of such advertising, a copy of the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration is enclosed. Your attention is directed to A.R.S. 32-145 as it appears on Page 11. You may also note that A.R.S. 32-144, A(4) on Page 10 describes the exemptions under which anyone is permitted to design buildings, structures, alterations or single family dwellings. A copy of the Rules of the Board is also enclosed for your general information.

RULE I. GENERAL RULES

A. Applications, General

3. Architectural applicants required to submit a treatise on seismic forces will not be scheduled for evaluation until the treatise has been submitted, satisfactorily graded and accepted by the Evaluation Committee.

RULE II. EXAMINATIONS

A. General Rules, Applicants for Registration

Initial Examination

1. Applicants for registration held for written examination as a result of initial Board action on their original application or re-application will be denied their application for registration and forfeit all application and examination fees if they fail to take their first scheduled written examination following notification of their being held for written examination. However, the Board may waive this rule when an applicant who is unable to take the first scheduled written examination notifies the Board at least ten days prior to the scheduled examination date and requests an extension in writing. Applicants for registration held for written examination pursuant to this rule, who have been granted an extension on the first scheduled written examination and who fail to take the next regularly scheduled written examination offered by the Board, shall have their application for registration denied.

Re-Examination

- 2. Applicants for registration who take the written examination pursuant to Rule II, A(1), and fail to achieve a passing grade will be allowed to re-examine. To be re-examined, applicants for registration must request re-examination thirty days prior to the next scheduled written examination date, by letter, and pay the scheduled re-examination fee for each part of the examination on which a passing grade was not achieved. Applicants who fail to request re-examination and pay the scheduled re-examination fees for two consecutive examination periods shall have their application for registration denied.
- 5. Written examinations will be given at a time and place established by the Board. The Board shall select and publish the examination dates and locations at least 90 days prior to the date selected.
- B. General Rules, Applicants for Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, Landscape Architect-in-Training
- 3. Applicants for Architect-in-Training will be permitted to take the Architect-in-Training examination after graduation from an accredited architectural school. The graduates from an accredited architectural school

must obtain the signature of the Dean of the College of Architecture on their Architect-in-Training application form. Applicants without college degrees from an accredited architectural school desiring to enter the Architect-in-Training program will be permitted to apply after five years of architectural training under a registered architect by submitting an application to the Board bearing the approval and signature of the current employer. Permission to enter the in-training program, upon application, will be granted by the Architectural Evaluation Committee after review to determine that the applicant has the experience as outlined in the current standards of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in architectural work of a character satisfactory to the Board.

- 4. Architect-in-Training examinations will be given at a time and place designated by the Board. Application for the in-training examination and certification from graduates of an accredited architectural school must be received in the office of the Board at least thirty days prior to the scheduled date of the examination. Application for the in-training examination and certification from non-graduates requesting examination and certification under Rule I,B(3) must be received in the office of the Board at least sixty days prior to the date of the scheduled examination.
- 6. An Architect-in-Training may repeat any of the three sections of the Architect-in-Training examination. When the required years of satisfactory training have been attained, he will be given credit for all parts passed and may apply for professional registration. Upon action by the Board, he may then be held for the professional examination.
- 7. If an Engineer-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Fundamentals of Engineering will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 8. At the time of application for professional registration, credit will be given for Fundamentals of Engineering to any graduate of an ECPD accredited engineering curriculum.
- 9. If a Geologist-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Basic Geology will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 10. If a Landscape Architect-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for History and Theory; Planting, Design and Identification; and Landscape Architectural Design will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
 - 11. All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance.

- 2. Architect-in-Training -- The applicant is required to pass the first major section of the examination in architecture.
- 3. Architecture -- There are two major sections to the examination in architecture; namely, the equivalency examination and the professional examination. The equivalency examination consists of three parts which are Construction, Theory and Practice (8 hours); History, Theory and Planning (2 hours); Design (10 hours). Each of these three sections may be repeated if a passing grade is not achieved. Construction, Theory and Practice consists of three indivisible parts which are Structural; Construction Technology and Administration; and Environmental Control Systems. The professional examination is of 16 hours duration and may be repeated in total if a passing grade is not achieved. It consists of four indivisible parts which are Environmental Analysis; Architectural Programming; Design and Technology; and Construction. A passing grade of 75 percent will be required on each part of the examination.

RULE IV. PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

B. A.R.S. 32-141

3. The principal of the firm or officer of the corporation residing in Arizona (Rule IV, B(1) shall be assigned to the principal Arizona office of the firm or corporation. This principal may, at his discretion, operate other Arizona offices of the firm or corporation provided, however, that each office has in it a person registered under this Chapter. This regulation shall be interpreted to exempt only offices established to observe construction for conformance with contract documents and design.

The Architectural Evaluation Committee met on November 13 and 14, 1972, in Phoenix, Arizona, with the following members present:

The committee reviewed with the applicants who took the June, 1972, examinations their Site Planning and Architectural Design examinations which they had failed. Messrs. Jaggers, Kelly and Griffin and Mrs. Baron indicated after their review they would re-examine in December. Mr. Pongraz was advised he should retake the examination in Michigan where he is now residing. The committee recommends to the Board that Edward Robert Pongraz, File No. 72-139, be denied registration in accordance with Rule I, A(6) which states that the Board does not grant registration to residents of other states.

The committee reviewed the following applicants and make to the Board the recommendations shown regarding their professional registration in Arizona:

Gentlemen: I have your letter of March 25, 1971 in answer to my letter to you of February 4, 1971. I am compelled to advise you that your Board's answer is totally unacceptable. I herewith resubmit my letter of February 4th and again request that your Board enforce the provisions of Statute Law and your Code, and to amend your By-Laws to eliminate the acceptability of Civil Engineers practicing land surveying "by custom and tradition" rather than by a demonstration of competency. This policy is not in the best interest of either of the professions. Neither is it in the best interest of the Public. It is for the best interest of the Public that your Board was established by Arizona Statute, and it is your solemn obligation to act in the best interest of the Public. The time has long since passed when we can afford to let this serious problem go unresolved by cloaking it in the policy of "custom and tradition". If the Statute is a good Statute, it should be zealously enforced. If it is not a good Statute, it should be properly amended or it should be repealed. The fees paid by your registrants are paid in good faith that the interests of both of the professions and of the Public be best served. Custom and tradition cannot longer be condoned as a yardstick for competency. To do so is a disservice to all concerned and a dereliction of your solemn duty. I enclose for your consideration a copy of a news release to be found at page 52 of the October 1971 issue of 'Consulting Engineer' magazine. Re: A.R.S. § 32-142 A.

Gentlemen:

This is in reply to your letter of September 28, 1972 wherein you state that a School Board in Arizona has engaged a building contractor to construct an elementary school and that the contractor then engaged a registered architect to perform the architectural services. You ask whether the fact that the architect was engaged by the contractor and not directly by the school board constitutes a violation of A.R.S. § 32-142 A. That section provides that:

"Drawings, plans, specifications and estimates for public works of the state or a political subdivision thereof involving architecture, engineering, assaying, geology, landscape architecture or land surveying, shall be prepared by or under the personal direction of, and the construction of such works shall be executed under the direct supervision of a qualified registrant within the category involved."

A.R.S. § 32-142 A provides that architectural drawings, plans, specifications and estimates for public works be prepared by or under the personal direction of a qualified architect and that the architectural category of the construction of such works be executed under the direct supervision of a qualified architect. This section concerns only the fact that the architectural work must be performed and supervised by an architect. It is a public welfare and safety measure and it has no concern with the question of who employs the architect.

Chairman Wyatt introduced the Complaint No. 72003 in the matter of Cadmus L. G. Goss, a registered Land Surveyor, No. 5096.

Respondent Cadmus L. G. Goss indicated he was present and was represented by his counsel, Richard Herbert.

The Board was represented by Stirley N. Cantor, Assistant Attorney General.

The Chairman asked for approval of waiving of reading the complaint which was approved by the respondent. The hearing was conducted and testimony by the above indicated discrepancies of the boundary surveys which the respondent had recorded with the Cochise County Recorder of Units 10, 11 and 12 of the Twin Lakes Country Club in Cochise County, Arizona, for Universal Properties, Inc.

At the conclusion of all testimony, the Chairman advised the respondent Cadmus L. G. Goss he would be notified of the Board's decision.

After the Board's deliberation, it was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the respondent Cadmus L. G. Goss be found guilty as charged in Complaint No. 72003 and his certificate of registration be suspended for a period of 120 days. Motion carried unanimously.

At 1:30 P.M., Chairman Wyatt called the special meeting to order and Mr. John Stitzer, representing the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping appeared before the Board.

Mr. Stitzer explained he was making this appearance to seek the Board's assistance in the implementation of House Bills 2027 and 2028 for recording Record of Survey and Record of Monumentation with the County Recorders. Mr. Dryden suggested they contact Mr. Henry Ochs of the Colorado State Board as to their standardization procedures as they have had a similar law for two or three years.

Mr. Stitzer stated that in order to make the land surveyors and civil engineers aware of this new law, he was also here to ask for a mailing list from the Board's records.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wallace that the Board grant American Congress on Surveying and Mapping permission to use our mailing list if available. Motion carried.

Mr. Stitzer thanked the Board for their assistance and said they would contact the Department of Finance for the mailing list.

The A.I.A. Plans Review Committee, composed of Craig Walling, Chuck Pearson and James Fulton, Architects and Carl Adam, Structural Engineer, appeared before the Board.

Mr. Walling gave a little of the history of how this committee was formed and how they reviewed the plans which had been submitted to the City of Phoenix by their peers. At first, these plans were not a matter of public record but this has been rescinded and the committee may review the plans. Since they found so many of the plans which needed rejecting due to not meeting the codes established, the committee is seeking of the Board any suggestions for resolving the matter.

It was suggested that they file a complaint when they had enough evidence for the Board to hold a hearing as outlined in A.R.S. 32-128.

Discussion followed as to the fact of whether it can be an oral or written complaint. It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the Chairman instruct the Executive Director to get an opinion from the Attorney General whether the name of the oral complainant be a matter of record. The motion carried with four ayes and 3 nayes.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that if this committee finds a set of plans, they give them to our Executive Director, and the Board will assist the committee in every possible way they can. Motion carried.

It was the intent of the Engineering Committee to try the national examination for one time only which was prepared by members of the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping and not by the Clemson staff. Dr. Newlin reported that Mr. Dryden was a member of the National Committee that helped to prepare this examination, and he feels, at a national level, it is a good one and would like to see Parts 1 and 2 of the national exam tried this one time. Dr. Newlin gave some statistics on those land surveyors who had passed when prepared by Phil Newlin and when prepared by Phil Borgo which indicated a smaller percentage had passed since they were prepared by Mr. Borgo. Mr. Girand felt the percentages reflected the fact that there were no educational courses in this State for land surveyors, which is also of great concern to the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping, Arizona Section.

Mr. Girand discussed the review of the Civil examinations Parts 3 and 4, and he noted that it was very clear that the percentage of failures was substantially higher over the past examinations. He stated that either the Evaluation Committee is not performing its function properly or the examinations being given are not adequate and do not test the applicant's knowledge of the problem. The consensus of the committee was in total the examination was too difficult and the committee should more carefully evaluate the questions prior to their use. Also, re-evaluate the procedures of the Evaluation Committee.

Dr. Newlin presented the Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting report of February 22, 23, 26 and 27, 1973, and March 2, 1973, as shown on Minute Pages 3160 - 3175. It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the report of Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt reported on his attendance at the Western Conference of National Architectural Registration Boards' meeting in Salishan, Oregon, on March 7, 8, 9 and 10, 1973. He stated basically, the general discussion was on the new examination format which will be given the first time in June, called the Equivalency Examination. The Professional Examination will be given the first time in December. These examinations will be used by all of the States except New Jersey, Illinois and Idaho. Some states will not be giving any part of the old examination and other States, including Arizona, will also use the old examination along with the new for some undetermined length of time. He reported California is making a study of those with experience only and those with a degree plus which schools attended for comparison of how successful the examination is, and they will send a copy of this study to our Board. He reported that applicants in 5 or 6 states over the next 5 to 10 years will be required to have a professional degree, and by 1980, a masters will be required. In many of the states, six years will be granted for education, considering it is a second degree.

Mr. Wyatt felt that Arizona should make a study on the educational qualifications of its applicants compared to the non-educational applicants. It was suggested that the Architectural Committee cover this.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that Mr. Wyatt's report be accepted and authorization granted for his travel to this meeting. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

No report.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director presented Cash Flow Report #3 and commented that expenses through June 30 are expected to be approximately \$92,600 compared with \$83,235 expended in 1971-1972. The current appropriation is \$96,496, leaving approximately \$3,900 available for moving expenses and other contingencies.

Higher volume is the primary reason for the increased expenditure. The percentage increase in applications, registrations, and examinations runs from 20 to 25%.

The Budget Request for 1973-74 was \$104,400, with an addendum of \$1500 to cover the estimated increase in cost of the Annual Report.

It was moved by Mr. Place and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the report of the Executive Director of Cash Flow Report #3 be approved as presented on Minute Page 3181. Motion carried.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Letter from A. R. Turk, Chairman, SEAOA Committee for Uniformity and Reciprocity of Registration Laws, was presented as shown on Minute Page 3182.

Chairman Wyatt asked Mr. Turk, since he was in attendance, for any comments to his letter. He stated that the Structural Engineers Association had contacted California regarding their structural examinations which are given once a year of 16 hours duration. Mr. Girand stated that to become a structural engineer in California, you must be a civil engineer then you must practice for two or three years before you can take the structural examination. In Arizona, it is possible to become registered as a structural without having a civil registration and would not have to know any civil engineering. If Arizona should require the structural engineer to first become registered as a civil, then we could consider Parts 7 and 8 to the present examination.

Dr. Newlin stated he would like to see a recommendation from the Structural Engineers Association regarding this - does the Structural Engineers Association think that we should, in response to the questions contained in their letter, change from 8 hours to 16 hours and if so, why? This Board would then consider it and we would do whatever needs to be done to go from two to four parts.

Mr. Girand suggested that the structural engineers should meet and discuss same and draft a formal letter to the Board.

Dr. Newlin stated that we are having difficulty at this time of finding someone to prepare the structural examination and we do need a hand in preparing same.

Mr. Girand felt the examination should cover the entire field of structural engineering.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that upon receipt of additional factual information from the Structural Engineers Association as suggested by Dr. Newlin, a committee consisting of Dr. Newlin, Mr. Girand and Mr. Wyatt review their recommendation. Motion carried.

As I had written previously, the Structural Engineers Association of Arizona has formed a committee to study and promote uniformity and reciprocity of state registration laws, particularly with regard to Structural Engineering. It is in this regard that I am writing this letter.

As you are probably aware, Section 6759 of California's registration law now permits California to grant registration without examination to "... any person holding a certificate of registration issued to him by any state or country when the applicant's qualifications meet the requirements of this chapter, and the rules established by the board."

In regard to Structural Engineering, one of California's requirements is that the applicant pass 16 hours of examination over and above the Civil Engineer exam. This committee would like to know if the State Board would favor expanding the Structural Engineer exam from 8 hours to 16 hours over and above the Civil Engineer exam?

Also, California has in the past offered one of the western states the opportunity of holding a joint structural examination. Inasmuch as California offers their Structural Engineer exam once annually, this committee would like to know if the State Board would favor a joint structural examination with California, if offered, on parts 5, 6, 7, and 8?

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

At the December 1, 1972, Board meeting, the Chairman appointed an ad-hoc committee consisting of John Girand, C. W. Dryden, James L. Knickerbocker, Lew Place and M. L. Vanlandingham to review the National Council of Engineering Examiners Suggested Model Rules of Professional Conduct for Adoption by State Registration Boards, and as a result of their review, the committee requested the Chairman to have the Executive Director write a letter to the Attorney General for an opinion on these suggested models rules of N.C.E.E.

The Assistant Attorney General's opinion is as shown on Minute Pages 3187 - 3190.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the Board forget the whole business. Motion carried with Mr. Vanlandingham voting nay.

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Girand we reconsider the previous action for the purpose of tabling this item. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Discussion was requested on letter from Gerald L. Clark, President, Central Arizona Chapter, American Institute of Architects. Regarding this letter, Pages 3191-92, on the Paradise Valley High School, the Executive Director reported that the drawings and specifications of the student activities building were prepared by the school district staff for the purpose of securing bids of this portable steel building. After which the final plans would be designed by an engineer to be engaged by the successful bidder.

Mr. Knickerbocker stated that we advise Mr. Clark that the Board does sense some violation and ask him to consider this as a misdemeanor and to file action with the appropriate authorities or this Board can go into civil action.

Dr. Newlin felt that no violation has occurred. We should inform the schoool district a set of plans are required with an architect's seal or if they want to specify an engineer they can but final plans require an architect should be involved.

Also, suggested when writing the school board that the manner in which they are asking for bids is not in conformance with our law by requesting for public bids without the benefit of an architect or engineer's seal on the drawings.

It was moved by Mr. Place and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the Executive Director be directed to notify the Board of Trustees of Paradise Valley School District they are asking for bids of a public building in violation of the Arizona Revised Statutes as there are no proper seals on the drawings on which the bids are required with a carbon copy of this letter to Mr. Clark. Motion carried with Mr. Knickerbocker abstaining.

Mr. Wyatt stated that although the bid specification is not well drafted, it does call for a proposal to design and build, and that our response does not properly cover the problem involved.

Gentlemen:

This is in reply to your inquiry asking whether the State Board of Technical Registration would have statutory authority for the incorporation of the National Council of Engineering Examiner's "Suggested Model Rules of Professional Conduct for Adoption by State Registration Boards" into the rules of the Board.

The State Board of Technical Registration has authority under A.R.S. § 32-10 G A (1) to adopt rules only for the "performance of duties imposed upon it by law". One of those duties is determining disciplinary matters in relation to gross negligence, incompetence, bribery, or other misconduct in the practice of a registrant's profession under A.R.S. § 32-128. There would thus be authority for the Board to establish rules pertaining to these matters. There would be no authority to establish rules relating to "unprofessional conduct" or ethics outside of the specific areas falling within the Board's statutory duties.

With this in mind we will review each of the suggested model rules referring to the copy you sent us:

Suggested Rule No. 1 could be adopted by the Board if it found that not reporting the over-ruling of a registrant's judgment in his professional duties in circumstances where the public health, welfare and safety is endangered would constitute gross negligence under A.R.S. § 32-128 A(2).

Suggested Rules Nos. 2(A) and (B) appear to authorize conduct broader than the practice in another professional category allowed by A.R.S. § 32-143 and there would be no statutory authority for their adoption.

Suggested Rule No. 2(C) conflicts with A.R.S. § 32-125 C which allows a registrant to seal only work prepared by himself or his bona fide employee. There would thus be no statutory authority for its adoption.

Suggested Rule No. 2(D) requires an examination of a registrant to determine his competence in a specific matter or field prior to the performance of an assignment; there is no provision for post-registration examinations under Arizona law.

Suggested Rules Nos. 3(A), (B), (C) and 4(A), (B), and (C) pertain to general ethics. There is no statutory authority for their adoption by your Board.

Suggested Rule No. 4(D) prohibiting solicitation or acceptance of valuable considerations for specifying particular products could be adopted by the Board if its violation were held to constitute bribery under A.R.S. § 32-128 A.

Suggested Rule No. 4(E) pertains to general ethics, with no statutory authority for its adoption by the Board.

Suggested Rule No. 4(F) appears to be in conformance with A.R.S. § 38-503, which prohibits public officers from participating in decisions pertaining to their own services or products.

Suggested Rule No. 4(G) is much narrower than the activity authorized by A.R.S. § 38-503. It could not be adopted by the Board without specific statutory authority.

Suggested Rule No. 5(A) could be adopted only if the prohibited payments to secure work were held to constitute bribery under A.R.S. § 32-128 A in every instance in which such a payment might be made. If this would not be true, there would be no statutory State Board of Technical Registration March 5, 1973 Page Three

authority for adoption of the rule.

Suggested Rule No. 5(B) prohibiting competitive bidding would have no statutory authority for adoption, as solicitation of employment and contracts is not prohibited under Arizona law nor could it be established that competitive bidding on a project would in itself endanger the public health, welfare or safety.

Suggested Rule No. 5(C), prohibiting misrepresentation of qualifications and other acts could be adopted only upon a finding by the Board that its violation would in every instance constitute a violation of A.R.S. § 32-128 A (2) in contravention of the public health, welfare and safety.

Suggested Rule No. 6(A) could be adopted if the Board were to find that its violation would constitute a violation of A.R.S. § 32-128 A (2) in contravention of the public health, welfare and safety, but only if the written rule were modified to confine it to the use of the registrant's name or firm name in the practice of his profession.

Suggested Rule No. 6(B) could perhaps be adopted by the Board under its authority to make investigations under A.R.S. § 32-128 B, but the Board would have no authority to discipline a registrant for failure to comply with the Rule in the absence of specific statutory authority to do so.

The unnumbered suggested rule following suggested Rule No. 6, making conviction of a felony or revocation or suspension in another jurisdiction a violation of the statutes or of the rules, could not be adopted by the Board as it would require specific statutory authority and there is none in Arizona.

If any of the proposed rules are adopted by the Board, they must be worded so as to apply to all registrants governed by the Board, regardless of the individual professional category.

Dear Mr. Drewry:

A number of problems have been brought to my attention recently by a constituent of mine, and I would appreciate your comments. I am quoting directly from a letter received by me.

"The Land Surveyor examinator requires 16 hrs. This breaks down into 960 minutes. We are told there were close to 550 questions asked during the last examination, allowing an average of 1 minute and 45 seconds per question. Four hours of the test consists of computations of survey problems and other questions require sketches be made to clarify the answers. This materially reduces the per question time allowed for other questions.

Since the registration 7000 has been issued approximately 35 Arizonans and 39 out-of-staters have been registered. It is natural that the large majority of out-of-staters have been registered under reciprocity. Why such a small number of Arizonans?

Many of the Arizonans also hold Professional Engineers licenses. We are told that these do not write the Land Surveyors examination but are asked only a few simple questions. It would seem(1) that to pass the examination is impossible or practically so when given in full, (2) all people being registered as Land Surveyors are not required to take this examination.

03196 Edward G. Drewry February 23, 1973 There are many questions that need answering and clarification before long or there will be hard and bitter feelings between all P.E.'s and R.L.S.'s. Is the Board of Technical Registration inadvertently practicing discrimination towards the R.L.S.'s and applicants? Further to your letter on the subject of Land Surveyor examinations, the Board considered the matter at the regular meeting held on March 16, 1973, and will be pleased to discuss the situation with you at a suitable time.

The Board is of the opinion that the majority of applicants, although eligible to take examinations in accord with the law, are experiencing difficulty because their education has not provided the necessary fundamentals on which land surveying is based.

Many applicants have not graduated from high school. Some have attempted to acquire theoretical knowledge by means of home study; others have taken short courses wherever available.

The major problem today is that our schools, including the engineering schools, offer a very limited curriculum in land surveying. It is hoped that you might inquire into this condition, because the determination of boundaries for the purpose of conveyancing and recording is vital to the public welfare, and can be accomplished accurately only if the land surveyor has an adequate knowledge of the principles involved.

In the opinion of the Board, any substantial easing of the examination requirements to fit the average applicant's qualifications, would be detrimental to the public welfare.
